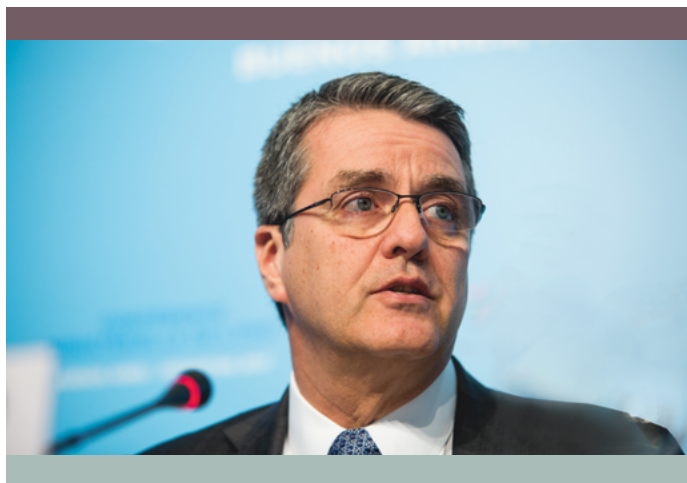

A message from Director-General Roberto Azevêdo



The COVID-19 pandemic has given rise to the deepest economic downturn of our lifetimes. Output has plummeted, while job losses pile up. Trade has been severely disrupted by supply and demand shocks. A key challenge for policymakers will be to lay the foundations for a strong, sustainable and inclusive economic recovery as the health crisis recedes. To make the right decisions about how to guide the global economy to recovery, they will need reliable data.

The WTO plays a critical role in compiling and analysing trade data. While the ongoing pandemic represents a dramatic break with nearly all recent economic trends, the fact remains that patterns in global trade offer useful insights for what the future may hold.

In 2019, even before the pandemic, world merchandise trade declined in volume terms by 0.1 per cent, weighed down by political tensions and protectionist measures. In value terms, which reflect commodity price fluctuations, merchandise trade fell by 3 per cent. For comparison, merchandise trade volumes grew by 2.9 per cent in 2018.

World trade in commercial services increased by 2.1 per cent in 2019, slowing from its 8.4 per cent rise in 2018. All services sectors were affected, with exports of transport services declining by 0.8 per cent as merchandise trade faltered, and travel exports growing by only 1 per cent. The only sector to record more positive growth – of 3.3 per cent – was “other commercial services”, reflecting growth in telecommunications, computer and information services.

World trade continues to be concentrated among major traders: the top ten traders in both merchandise trade and commercial services accounting for slightly more than half of world trade.

Among the least developed countries, merchandise trade fell by 2 per cent but trade in commercial services increased by 10 per cent, boosted in particular by diversification from merchandise to the travel sector – which has now been badly hit by the pandemic.

The COVID-19 pandemic has underlined the growing importance of the services sector, in particular the distribution sector, in keeping trade flowing. The crisis has also underlined the importance of digital trade.

Improvements in bandwidth and technological innovation have been the main factors for the increase in e-commerce and digital trade. These advances make vital services such as telemedicine possible. In addition, the services sector represents more than one-third of the value-added in pharmaceutical supply chains. Disruptions to supply chains due to the COVID-19 crisis have had a major impact on the supply of medical products and other vital goods.

The data in this report also reflect how changing consumer preferences in recent years have influenced global trade patterns, with consumers increasingly keen to reduce use and waste of products that have a damaging impact on the environment, such as plastics. Demand for renewable energy goods, such as wind turbines, solar panels and electric cars, has also increased significantly in the last few years.

Finally, the COVID-19 pandemic has highlighted the limitations of existing tools for measuring trade. Some countries have struggled to report trade data on a regular basis, and the system used to classify traded goods has proved to be insufficient to measure the full range of goods traded to tackle COVID-19. International organizations will need to increase co-operation to prepare themselves for future challenges of this scale.

I would like to thank everyone who has worked on this report. We hope it provides useful insights for WTO members and all those involved in trade analysis.

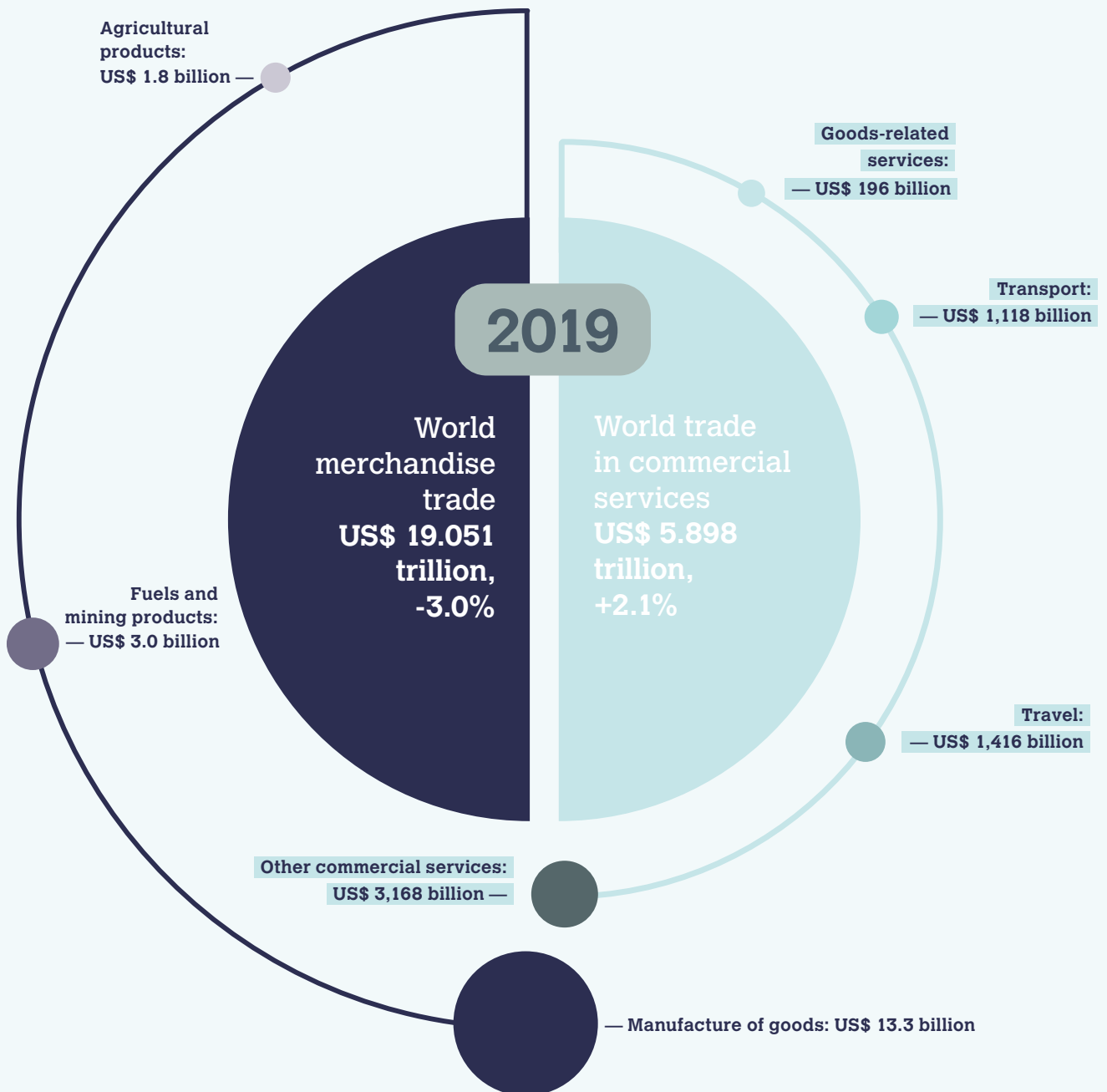

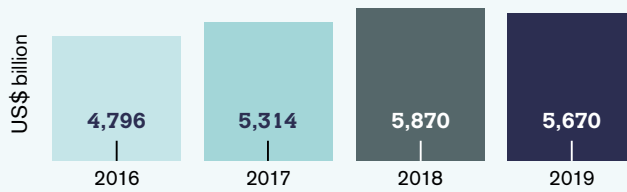

World trade in 2019

World merchandise trade in volume terms recorded a slight decline of 0.1 per cent in 2019 after rising by 2.9 per cent in the previous year. Merchandise trade is measured as the average of exports and imports. In value terms, trade declined by 3.0 per cent compared with an 10.2 per cent increase in 2018.

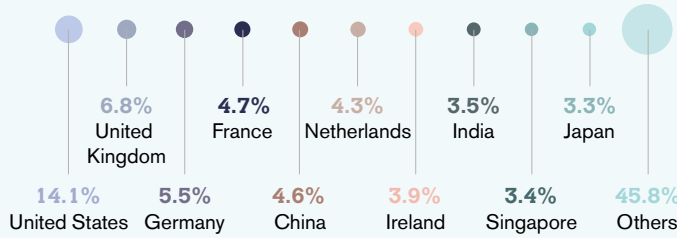
World trade in commercial services increased by 2.1 per cent in 2019, slowing substantially from its 8.4 per cent rise in 2018. Transport exports declined by 0.8 per cent as merchandise trade faltered. Other commercial services recorded the highest export growth (3.3 per cent) among services sectors in 2019, buoyed by slowing, but continued, growth in the telecommunications, computer and information services sector.





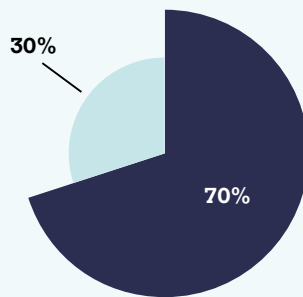
European Union

Merchandise trade of the European Union accounted for 30 per cent of world trade in 2019, totalling **US\$ 5,670 billion**.



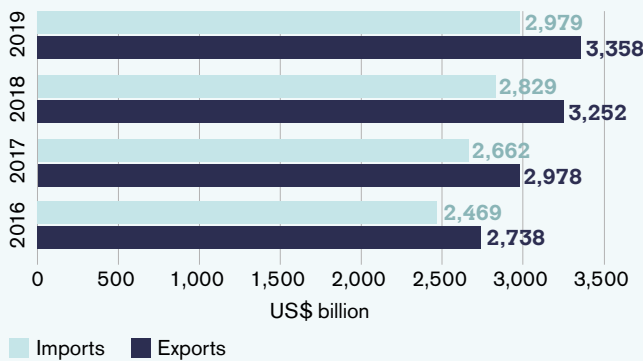
Commercial services exports

World exports of commercial services exports remain very concentrated. The top ten exporters accounted for **54.2 per cent** of global exports in 2019.



Manufactured goods

Trade in manufactured goods represents **70 per cent** of world merchandise exports. Iron and steel exports experienced the largest decline among manufactured goods in 2019, with a 12 per cent drop compared with 2018.



Other commercial services

“Other commercial services”, such as telecommunications or financial services, continued to dominate world commercial services trade. Total exports and imports amounted to **US\$ 3,358 billion** and **US\$ 2,979 billion** respectively.



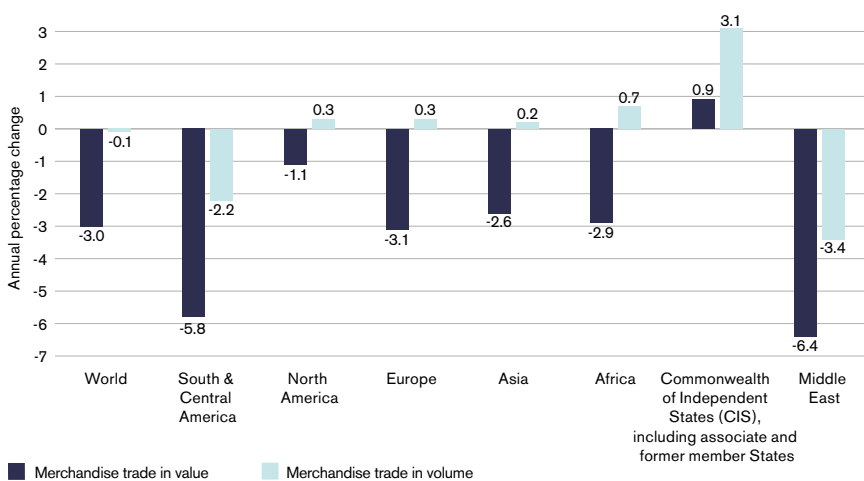
Least-developed countries (LDCs)

LDCs’ merchandise trade amounted to **US\$ 226 billion** in 2019, a 2 per cent decrease from 2018, while LDC commercial services trade totalled **US\$ 43 billion**, increasing by 10 per cent. Exporters of manufactured goods and oil accounted for 65 per cent of LDC merchandise exports. In services, travel receipts were the largest source of export earnings for LDCs.

World merchandise trade 2019

All regions recorded a decline in merchandise trade in terms of volume and value in 2019. The largest decline was in South and Central America and the Caribbean.

World exports of manufactured goods contracted by 2.0 per cent in 2019 but remain the leading component of merchandise exports.

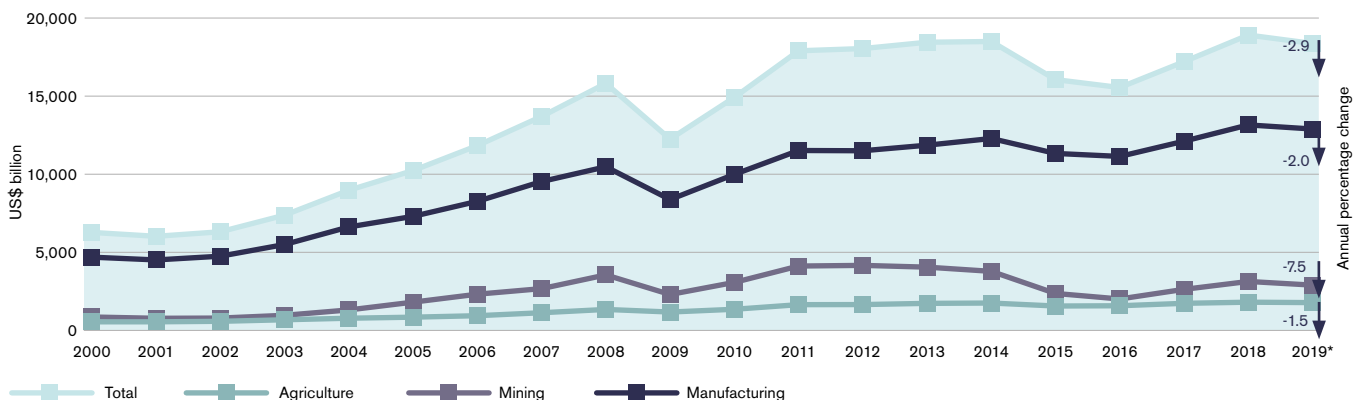

World agricultural exports decreased by 1.5 per cent in 2019, less than the overall decline for world exports.

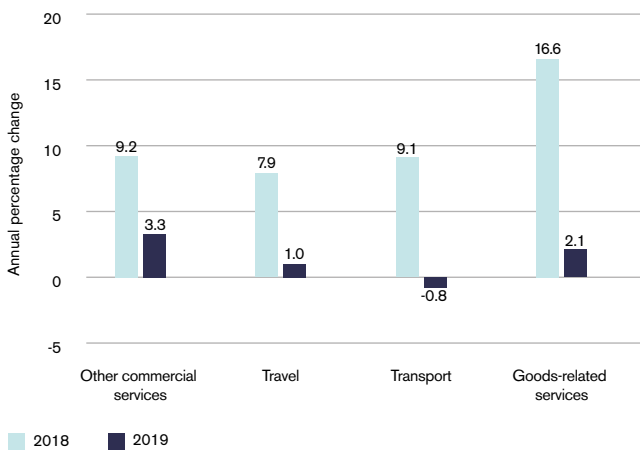

World exports of commercial services 2019

Commercial services exports slowed in 2019 (growth of 2.0 per cent) compared with 2018, with subdued growth in all main sectors and a decline in transport.

(Annual percentage change)



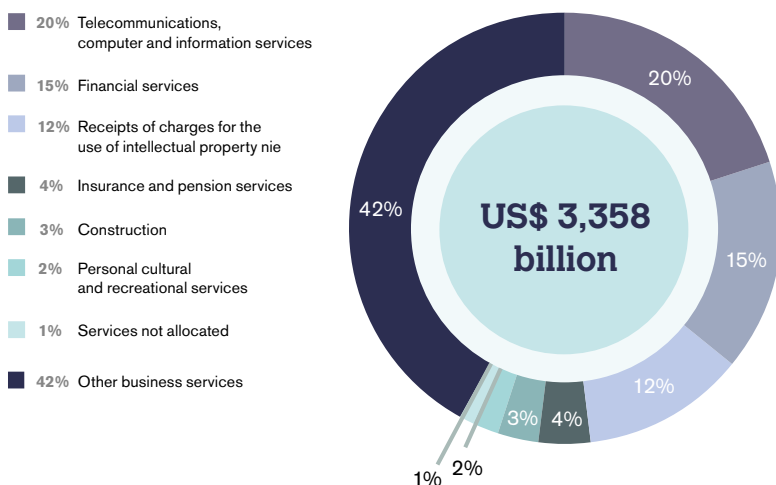

Other business services (42 per cent) and telecommunications, computer and information services (20 per cent) remained the largest exporting subsectors of “other commercial services”.

Computer services, which account for 81 per cent of telecommunications, computer and information services, grew 11 per cent in 2019, continuing an uninterrupted expansion since the 2009 financial crisis.

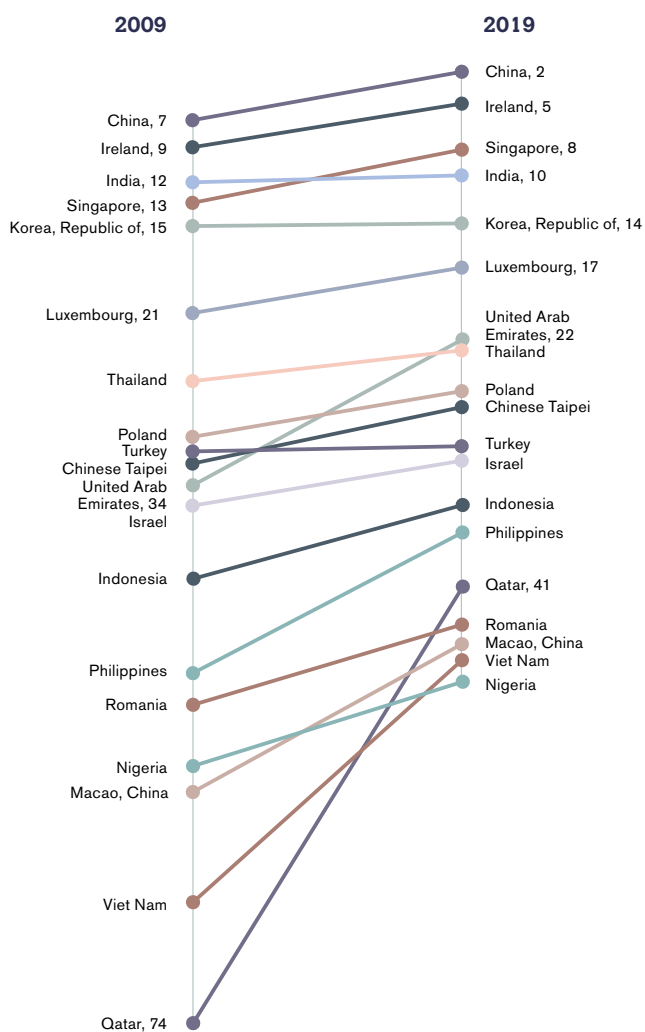
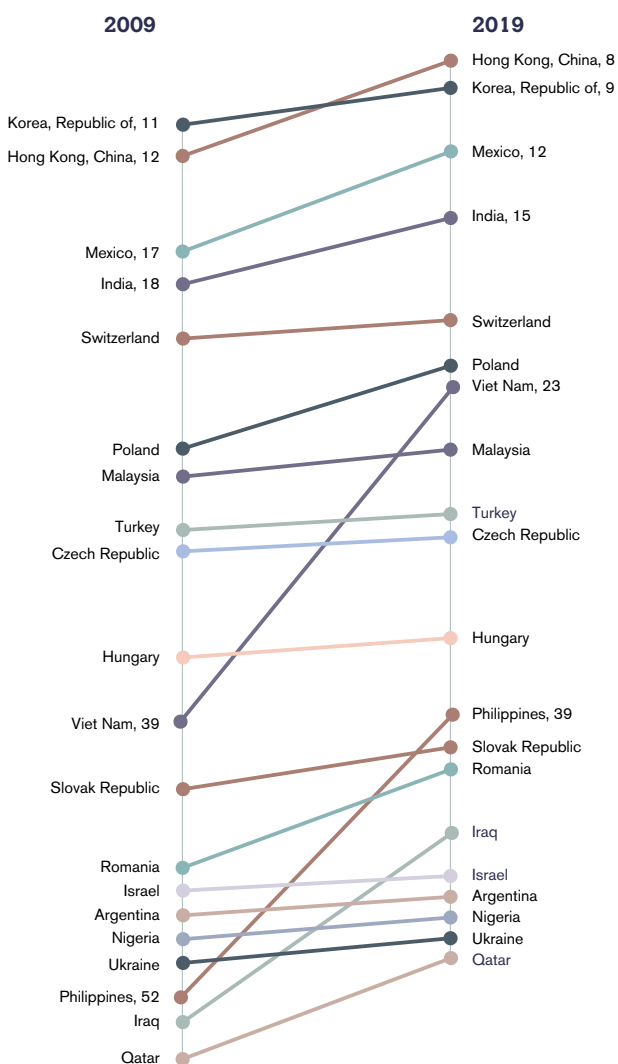
The world's leading traders

Among the world's top 50 traders, Viet Nam and the Philippines rose the most in world rankings for merchandise trade over the past ten years. Their active participation in global value chains, particularly in manufactured goods, was the main driving force for this improvement.

Qatar and the United Arab Emirates rose the most in world rankings for services trade from 2009 to 2019. Their central location has meant they are well-positioned to export transportation services. Furthermore, growing intra-regional tourism has contributed to growth.

 (Rank)



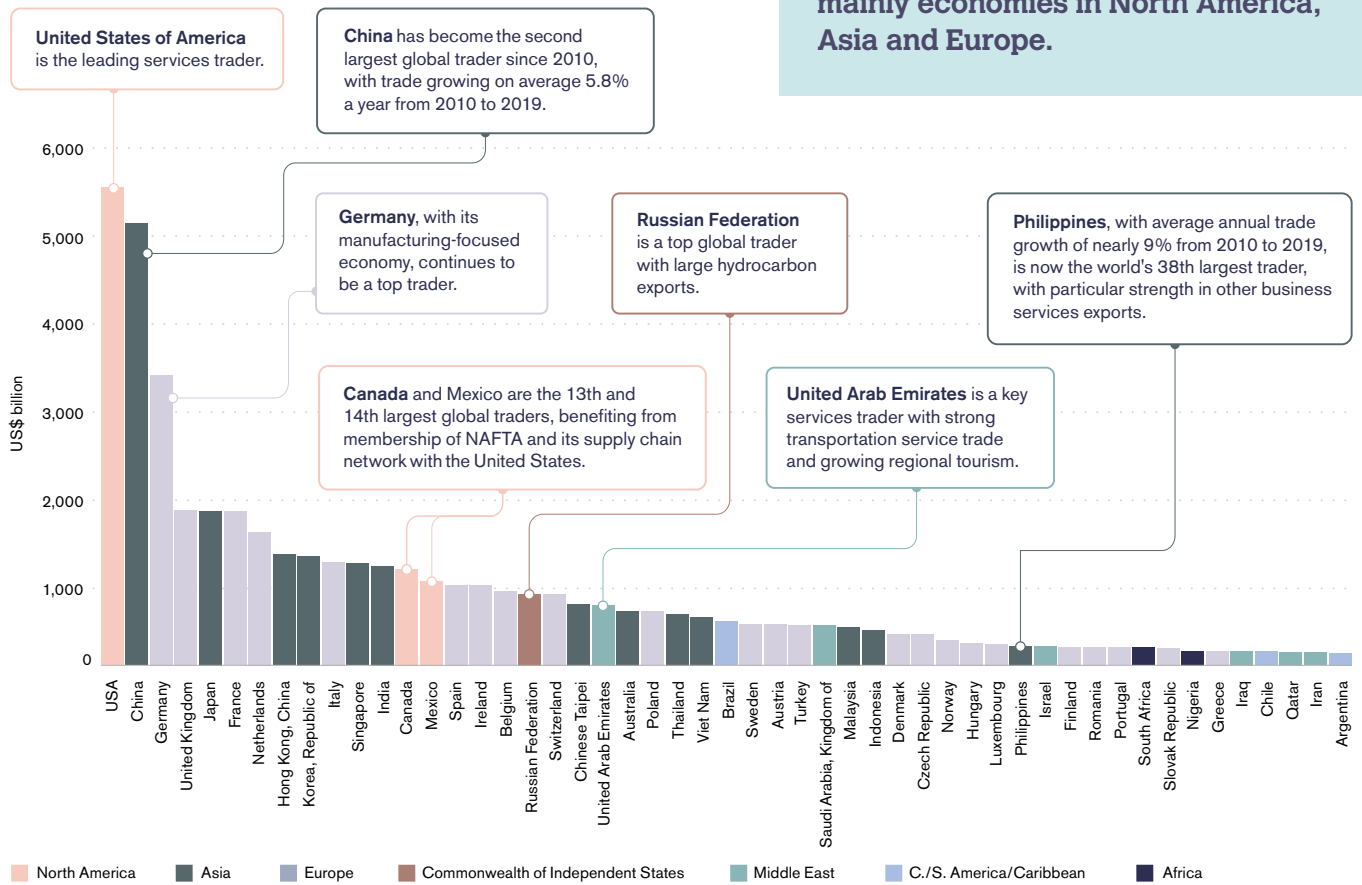

(US\$ billion)

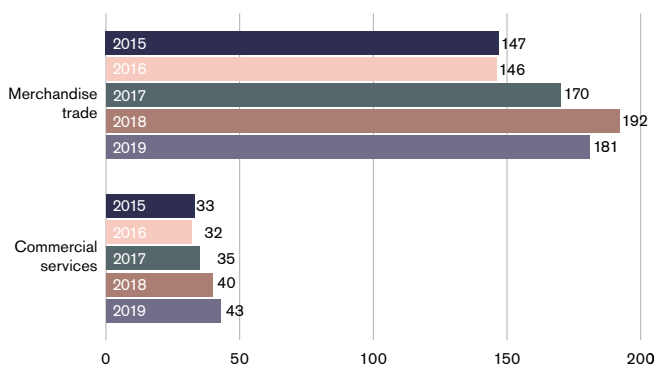

World merchandise trade volume declined by 0.1 per cent in 2019, the first contraction since the global financial crisis of 2008-09. Trade was weighed down by persistent trade tensions as well as by weaker global GDP growth, which slowed to 2.3 per cent in 2019 from 2.9 per cent in 2018.



The COVID-19 pandemic is likely to produce a significant contraction of world trade in 2020. New export orders for manufacturing and services shown in purchasing managers' indices (PMIs) fell sharply in the first and second quarters of 2020.



Trade declined in US dollar terms in 2019. World merchandise exports fell 3 per cent to US\$ 18.89 trillion. World commercial services exports increased by 2 per cent to US\$ 6.07 trillion but the pace of growth was down sharply from the 9 per cent recorded in 2018.



GDP growth turned negative in the first quarter of 2020 for the United States (-1.2 per cent), the euro area (-3.8 per cent) and China (-9.8 per cent). Further declines are expected in the second quarter and beyond.

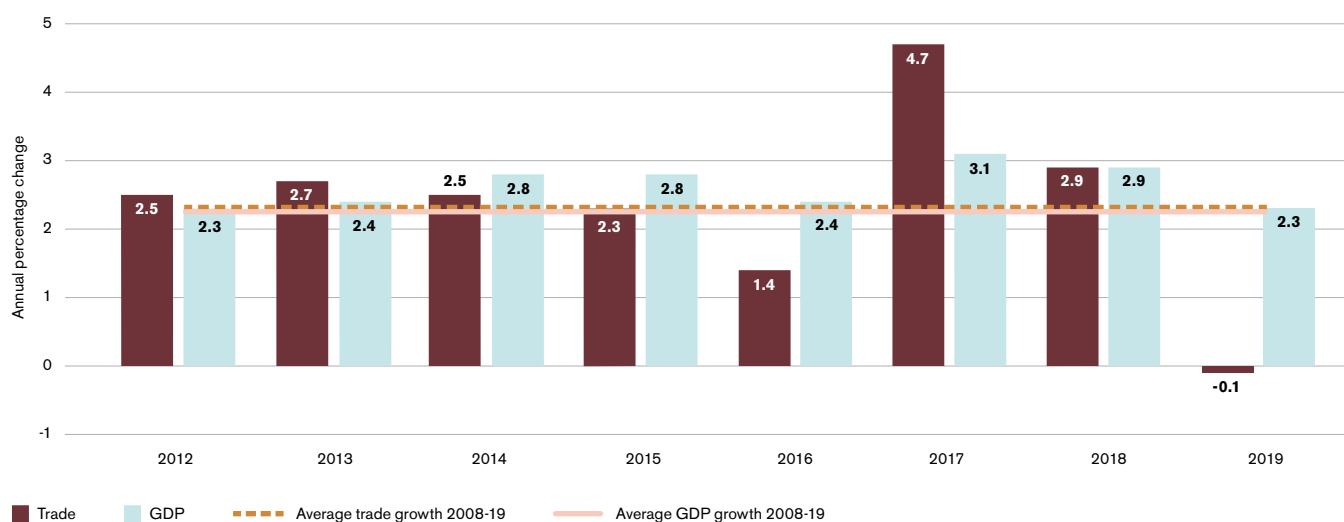
World trade and GDP

The volume of world merchandise trade declined in 2019 for the first time since the financial crisis of 2008-09, weighed down by rising trade tensions and weakening economic growth.

- Merchandise trade volume declined by 0.1 per cent in 2019, compared with 2.9 per cent growth in 2018. World GDP growth slowed to 2.3 per cent, down from 2.9 per cent the previous year.
- The US dollar value of merchandise trade fell year-on-year, dropping 3 per cent to US\$ 18.89 trillion in 2019. Trade declined more steeply in value terms than in volume terms due to falling export and import prices.
- Commercial services trade grew by 2 per cent in 2019, down from 9 per cent in 2018, as growth slowed and trade tensions escalated.
- The decline of 0.1 per cent for merchandise trade volume in 2019 was well below the average annual growth rate of 2.3 per cent since the financial crisis of 2008-09. GDP growth of 2.3 per cent last year was in line with its average rate over the past ten years.
- Although the first cases of COVID-19 were recorded in late 2019, the crisis did not contribute to the slowdown for the year. The pandemic is expected to lead to sharp declines in trade and GDP in 2020.

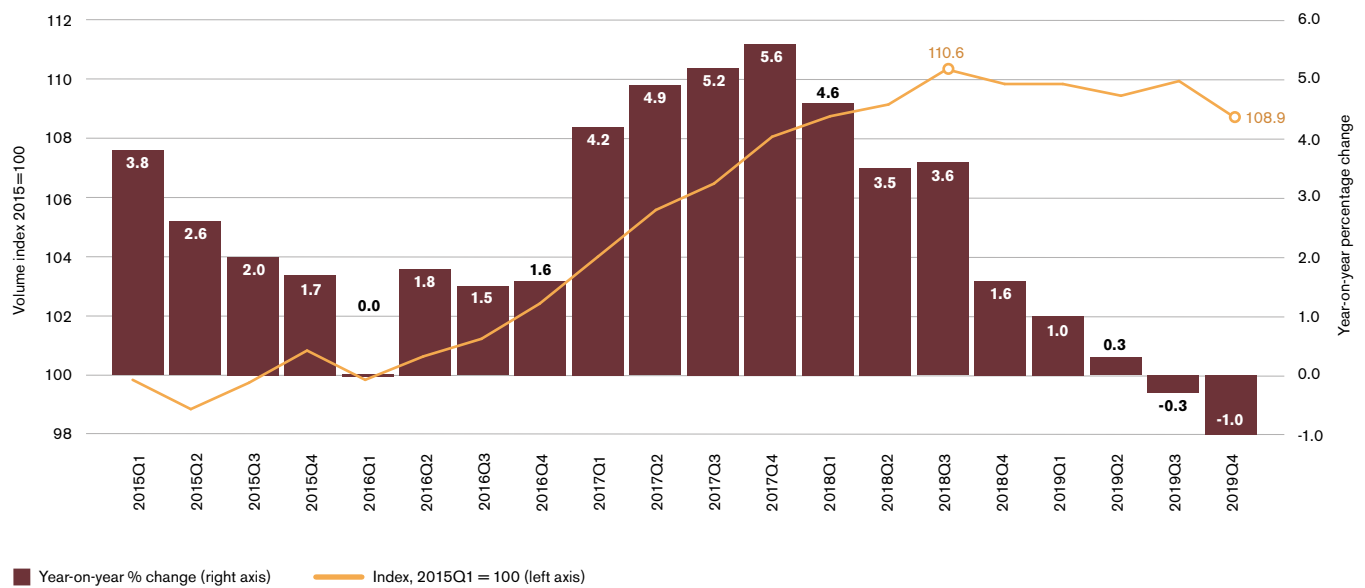
Merchandise trade volume

Global merchandise trade volume peaked in the third quarter of 2018 before stalling for several months and turning down in the fourth quarter of 2019.

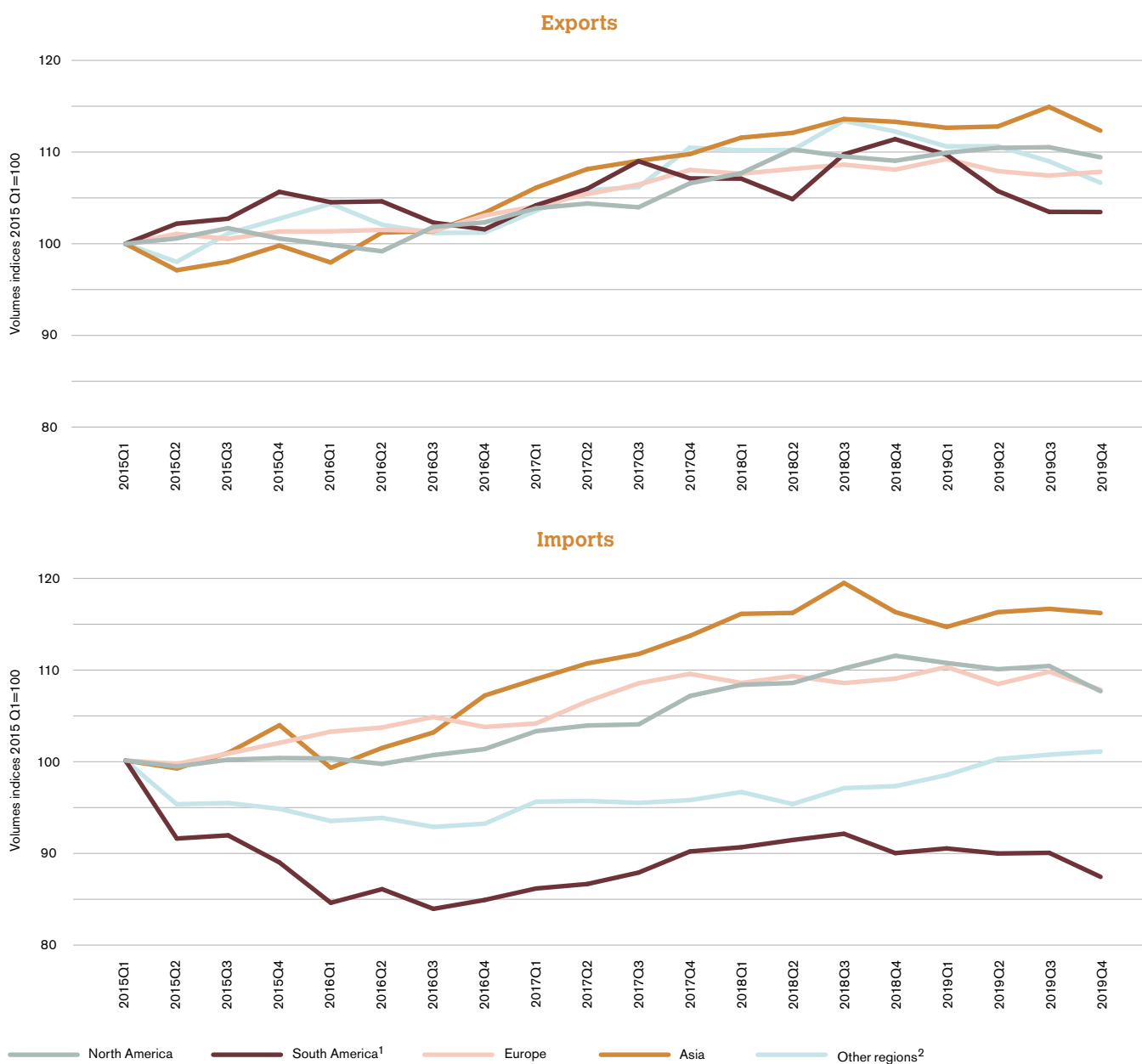
- Seasonally-adjusted merchandise trade volume was down by 1.0 per cent in the fourth quarter of 2019 compared with the same period in 2018 and 1.2 per cent down compared with the third quarter. This is equivalent to a 4.6 per cent decline on an annualized basis.
- The long-running trade dispute between the United States and China led to the raising of tariffs and contributed to trade policy uncertainty in 2019.
- Other factors contributing to economic uncertainty included the government shutdown in the United States in 2018-19, the United Kingdom's departure from the European Union, and changes in monetary policy in major economies.

Merchandise trade in the fourth quarter of 2019 varied strongly across regions.

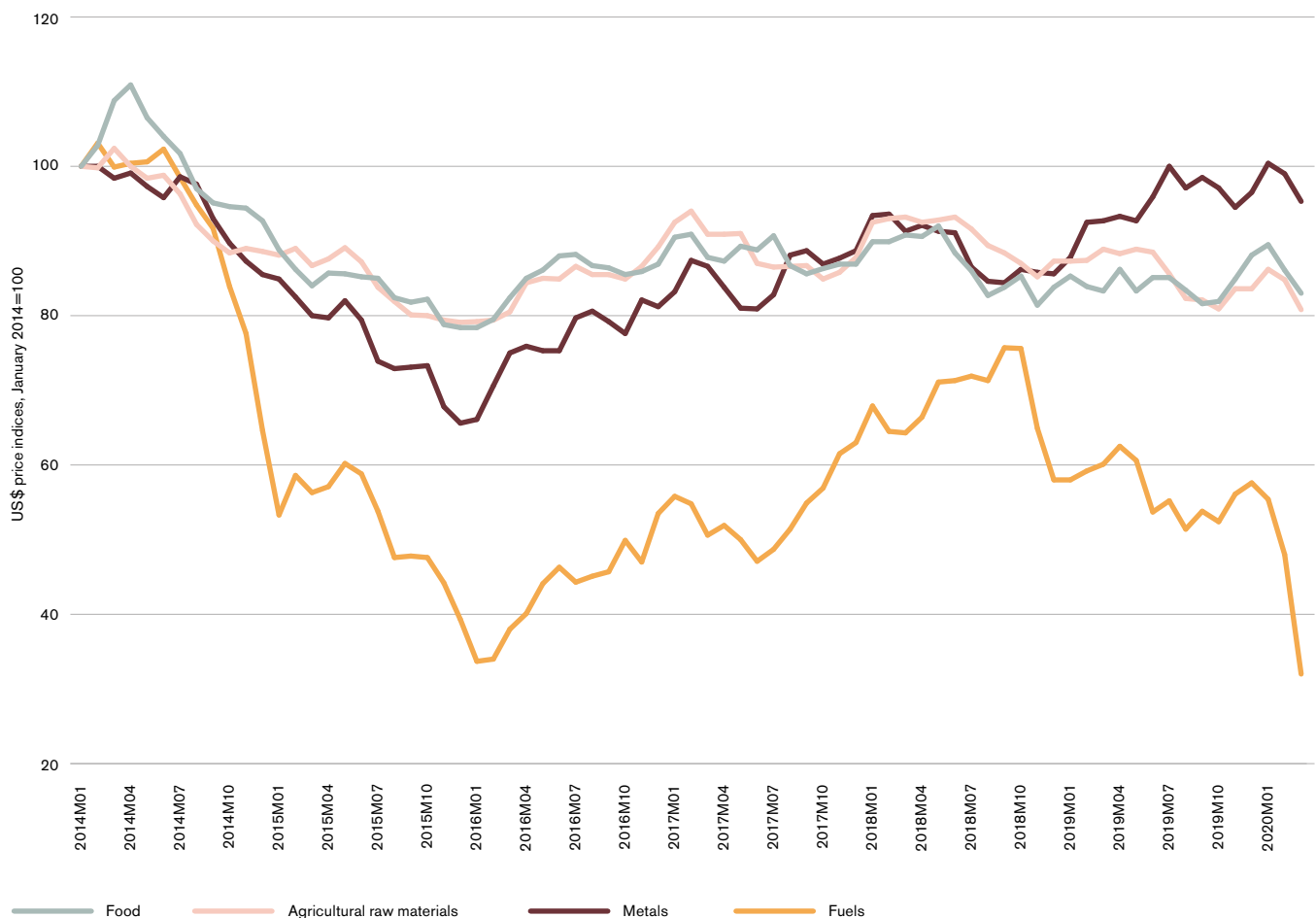
- Asia's merchandise exports were down 2.2 per cent quarter-on-quarter in Q4 of 2019. "Other regions" also saw a decline of 2.2 per cent. North America's exports were down 1.0 per cent over the same period while South America's export growth remained static at 0 per cent.
- On imports, South America recorded the strongest decline at -2.9 per cent in Q4 of 2019, followed by North America at -2.5 per cent and Europe at -1.8 per cent. Asia's imports recorded a more modest decline of -0.4 per cent while the imports of "Other regions" rose 0.4 per cent.
- Europe's exports were up slightly in Q4 of 2019, with an increase of 0.4 per cent.

Primary commodity prices

Commodity price fluctuations in 2019 were dominated by fuel prices, which were down 17 per cent compared with 2018.

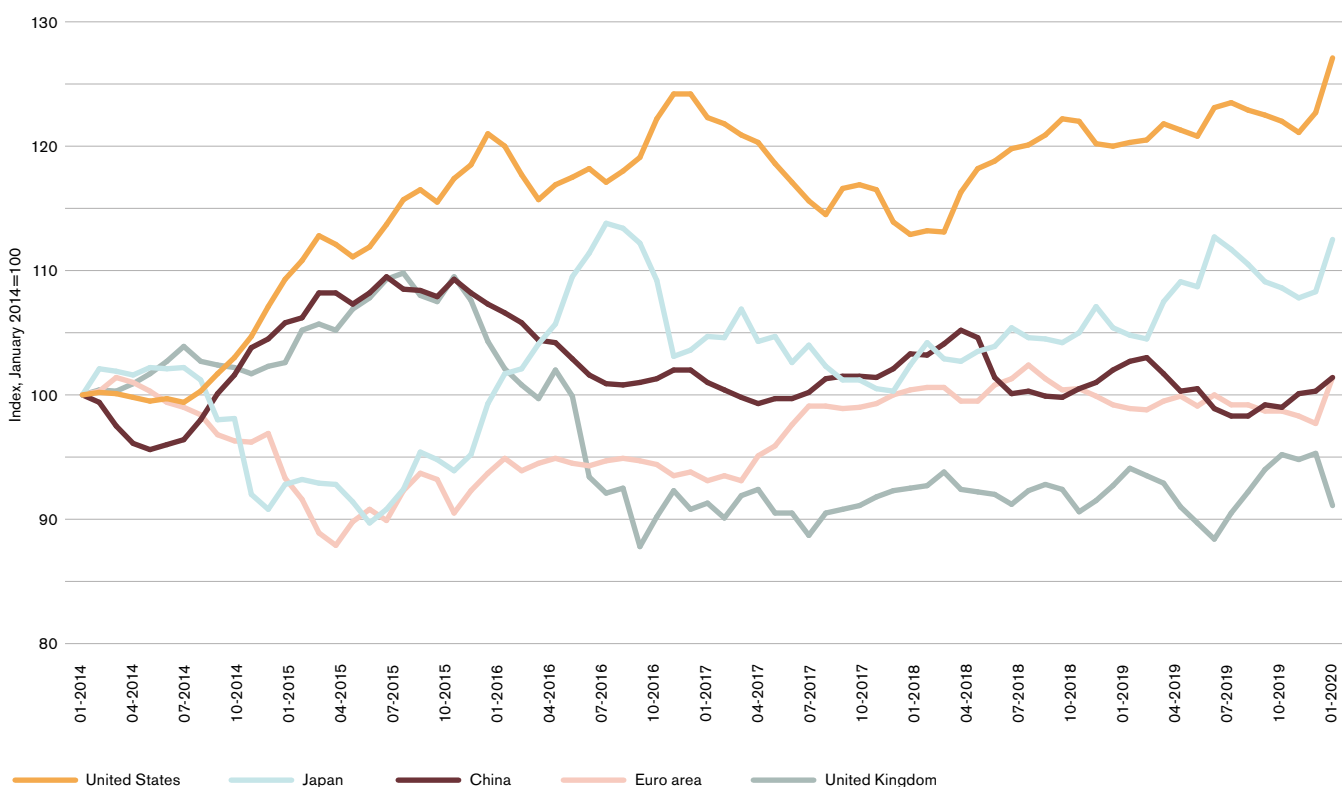
- Fuel prices were down 17 per cent in 2019 and are expected to record further declines in 2020 as travel restrictions and social distancing measures to combat the COVID-19 pandemic have reduced energy demand.
- Food and agricultural raw materials recorded declines of 3 per cent and 5 per cent respectively in 2019.
- In 2019, metals prices were up 7 per cent over the previous year.

Exchange rates

Exchange rates remained relatively stable in 2019 despite the heightened level of trade policy uncertainty.

(Index, January 2014=100)



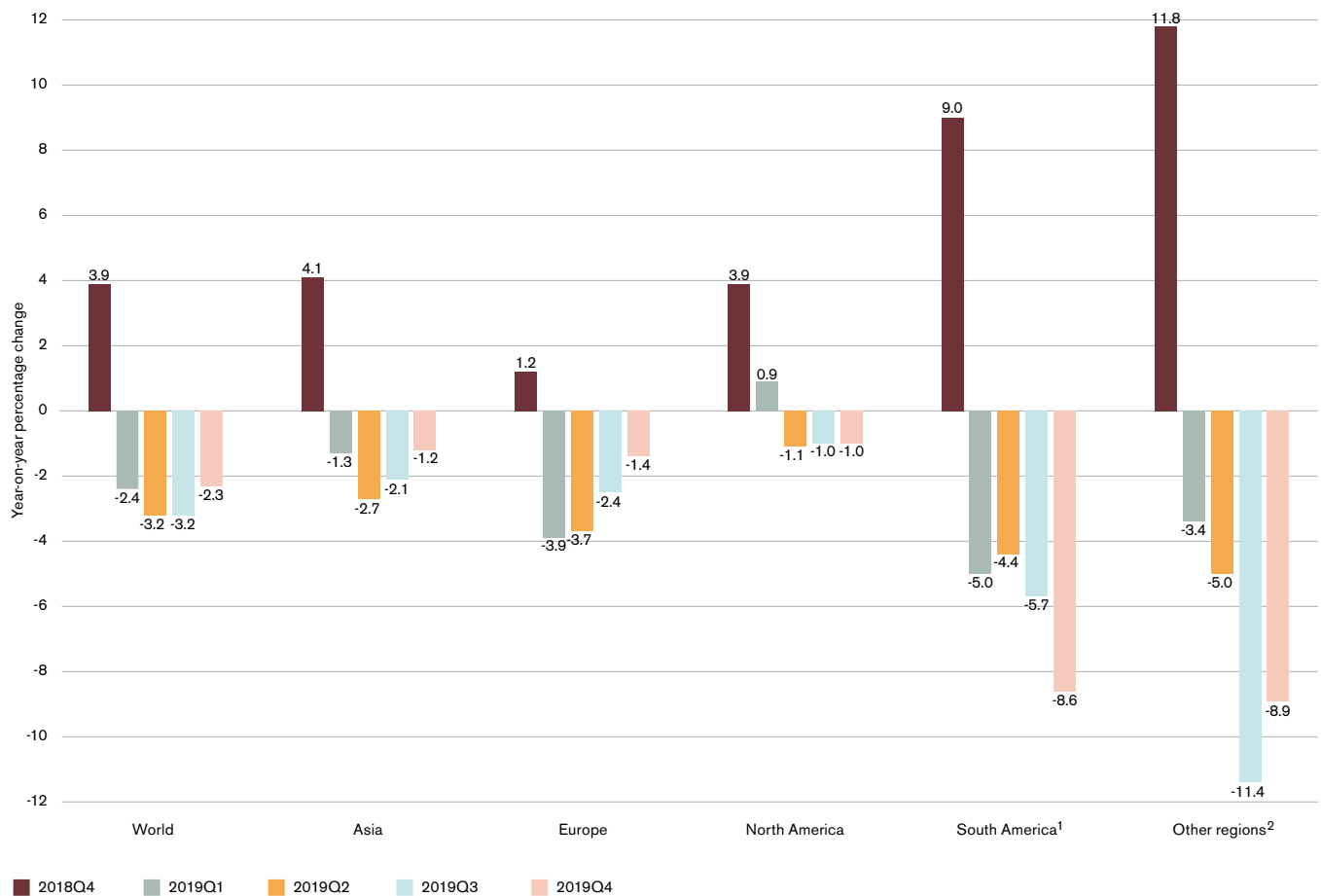

- The dollar rose 3 per cent on average against the currencies of US trading partners, while the euro and renminbi fell 1 per cent and 2 per cent respectively in 2019.
- The Japanese yen appreciated by 5 per cent in 2019 while the United Kingdom pound remained static at 0 per cent.
- The US dollar appreciated during the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, reflecting the currency's role as a financial safe haven. Further strengthening of the dollar could increase financial strain for net foreign borrowers with dollar-denominated debts.

Value of world trade

The dollar value of world merchandise exports was down in all four quarters in 2019 compared with the previous year, with the strongest declines recorded in regions that export natural resources in particular.

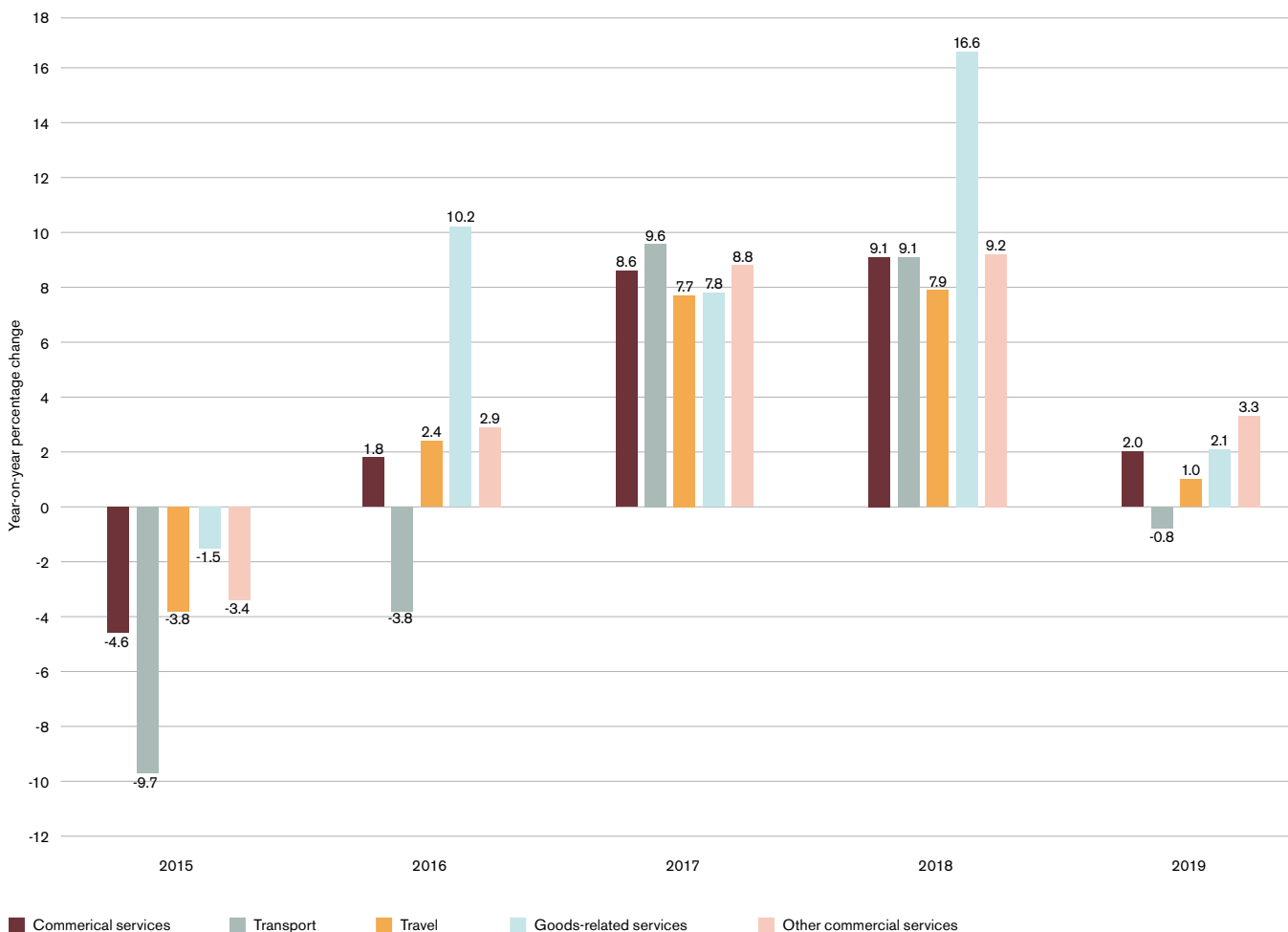
- Year-on-year growth in the US dollar value of merchandise trade fell from +3.9 per cent in the fourth quarter of 2018 to -3.2 per cent in the second quarter of 2019 before rising to -2.3 per cent in the fourth quarter of 2019.
- In the final quarter of 2019, North America, Europe and Asia all recorded modest declines of between 1 per cent and 1.5 per cent.
- South America and "Other regions" registered declines of -8.6 per cent and -8.9 per cent, respectively, in the fourth quarter of 2019 as lower oil and commodity prices reduced export revenues.

Services trade weakened in 2019 although it remained stronger than merchandise trade.

(Annual percentage change)



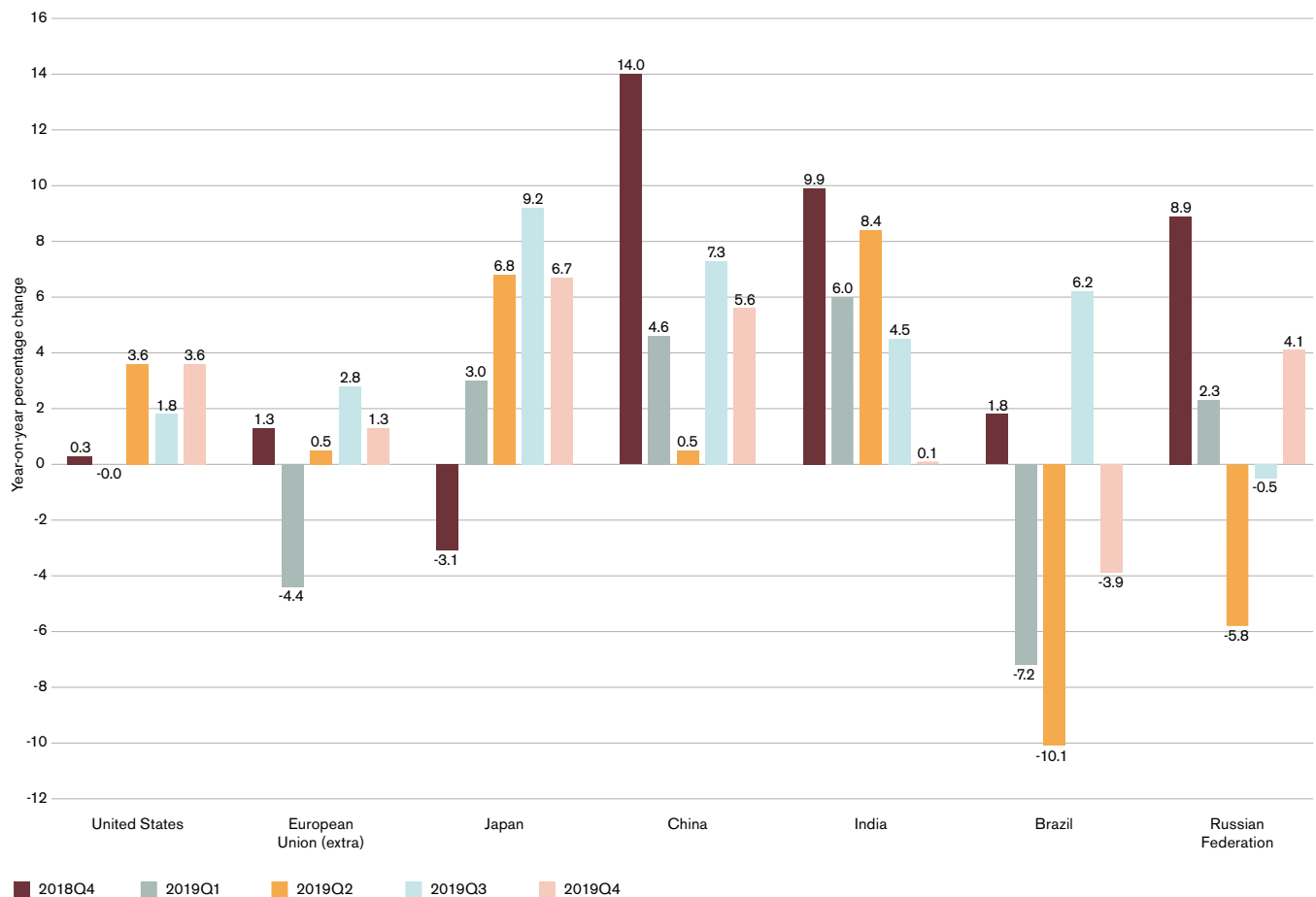

- Commercial services trade in 2019 was particularly weak in sectors linked to trade in goods.
- Year-on-year growth in the dollar value of world exports of goods-related services fell to 2.1 per cent in 2019 from 16.6 per cent in 2018.
- Exports of transport services declined by 0.8 per cent in 2019 after registering growth of 9.1 per cent in 2018.
- “Other commercial services” (including financial services, IT services) saw exports increase by 3.3 per cent in 2019. This still represents a significant slowdown from 2018, when exports increased by 9.2 per cent.
- Since exchange rate fluctuations were modest in 2019, the slowdown in commercial services trade is mostly due to real reductions in economic activity rather than a change in exchange rates.

Advanced economies such as the United States and the euro area recorded modest year-on-year growth in commercial services exports in US dollar terms in 2019 while Asian economies such as China, Japan and India grew slightly faster.

(Year-on-year percentage change)



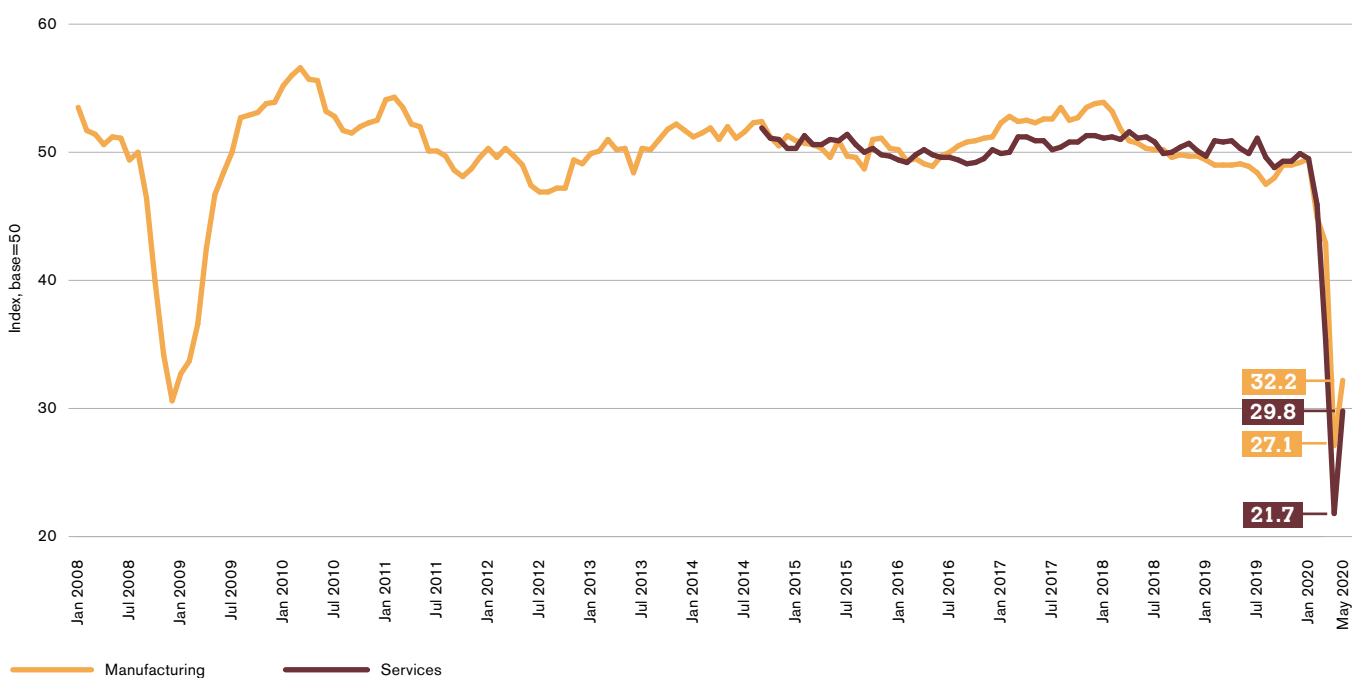

- India and China saw growth in exports of commercial services weaken over the course of 2019. By the fourth quarter, India's export growth had slowed to approximately 0.1 per cent from almost 10 per cent in the fourth quarter of 2018. China's growth slowed to 5.6 per cent from 14 per cent over the same period.
- Growth in US services exports rose to 3.6 per cent in Q4 of 2019 from 0 per cent in Q4 of 2018. Meanwhile, EU exports grew modestly, at around 1.5 per cent.
- Natural resource exporters saw volatility in their services exports in 2019. Brazil recorded negative year-on-year growth in three out of four quarters while Russia's exports weakened in the middle of the year before recovering toward the year-end.
- The COVID-19 pandemic is likely to have a strong negative impact on global services trade since many of the largest suppliers and consumers of services have imposed travel restrictions and social distancing measures.
- One category that may benefit from the pandemic is IT services, which has seen an increase in demand due to more people working from home.

COVID-19 and trade

The volume of world merchandise trade has fallen precipitously in the first half of 2020 as the COVID-19 pandemic has disrupted the global economy. Leading indicators provide clues about the extent of the slowdown and how it compares with earlier crises.

(Index, base=50)

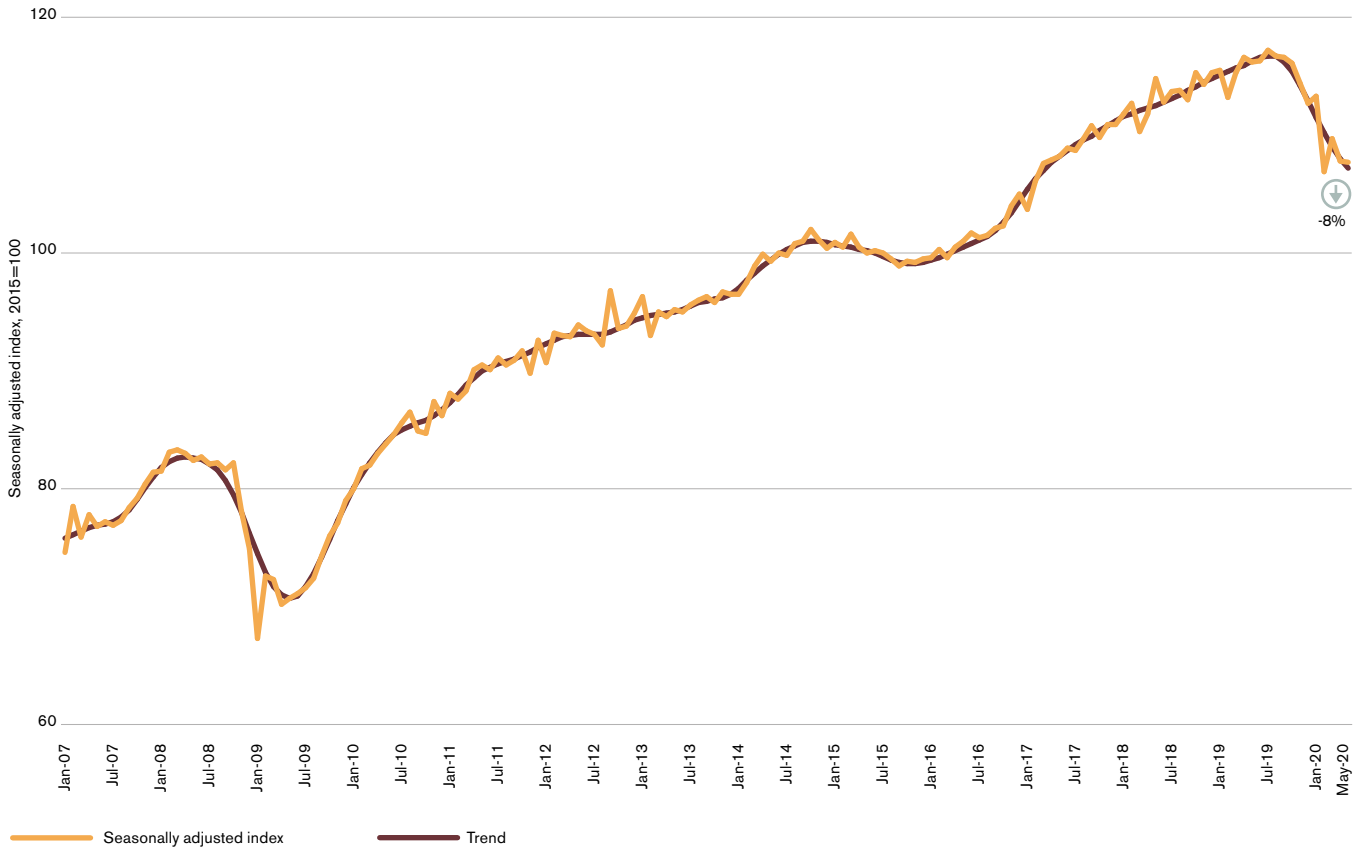

- Purchasing managers' indices (PMIs) show new export orders of manufacturers falling sharply to 27.1 in April 2020, compared with a baseline value of 50. In the same month, new export orders in services fell to 21.7, also measured against a baseline of 50.
- In May 2020, export order indices for manufacturing and services rebounded to 32.2 and 29.8, respectively, but they remained substantially below trend.
- Shifts in PMIs tend to foreshadow changes in actual trade flows, suggesting that trade levels may bottom out in April or May 2020 before starting to recover in June.

Container shipping has shown a downward trend as the COVID-19 pandemic has triggered recessions in economies around the world.

 (seasonally-adjusted index, 2015=100)

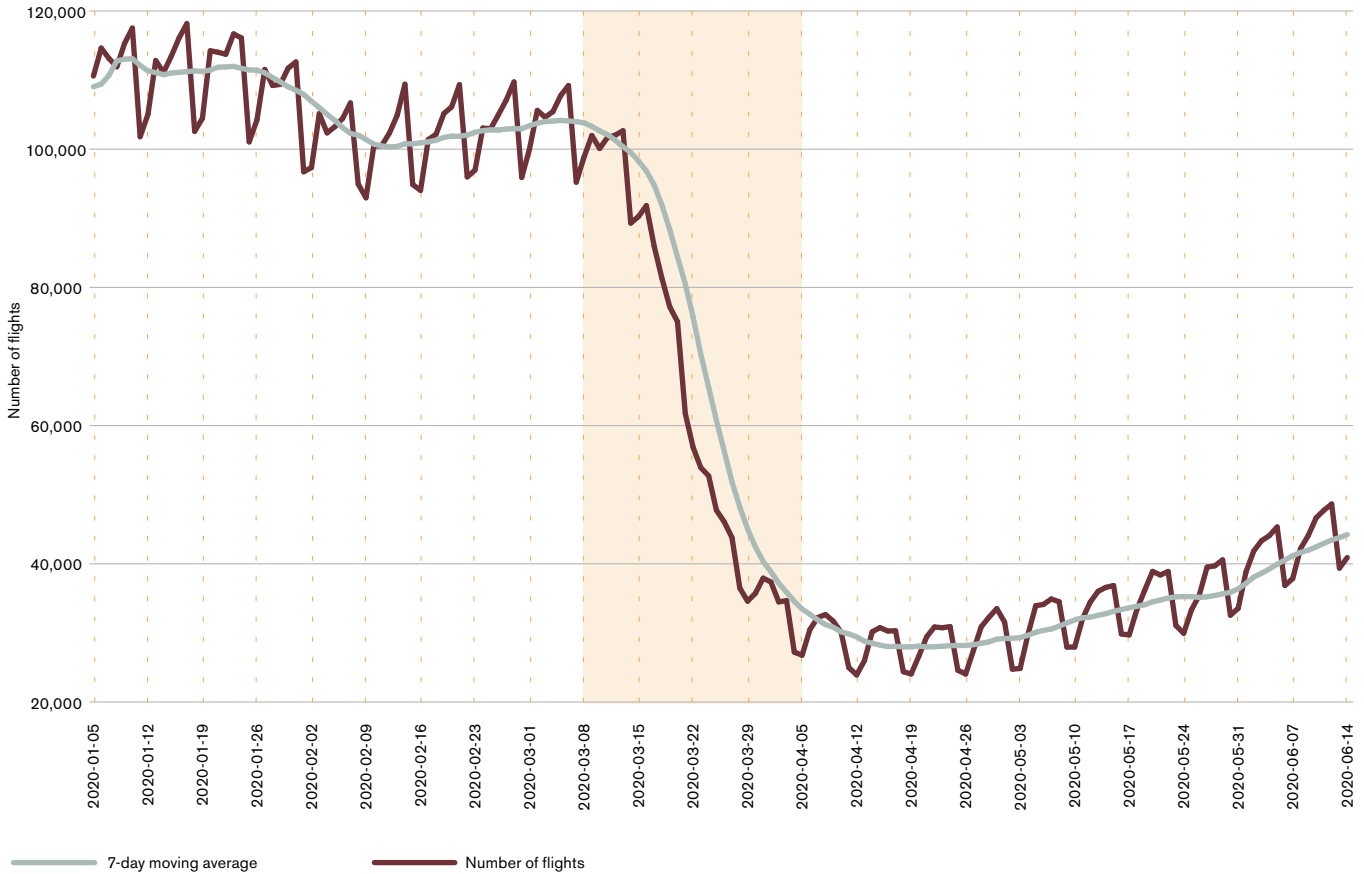

- A seasonally adjusted index of container port throughput was down 8 per cent year-on-year in May 2020, with no clear sign of bottoming out.
- The decline in 2020 is less than the 14 per cent drop from peak to trough during the financial crisis of 2008-09, indicating some resilience in container shipping in the face of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Air travel and transport have collapsed as strict social distancing measures and travel restrictions have been imposed.

 (Number of flights)



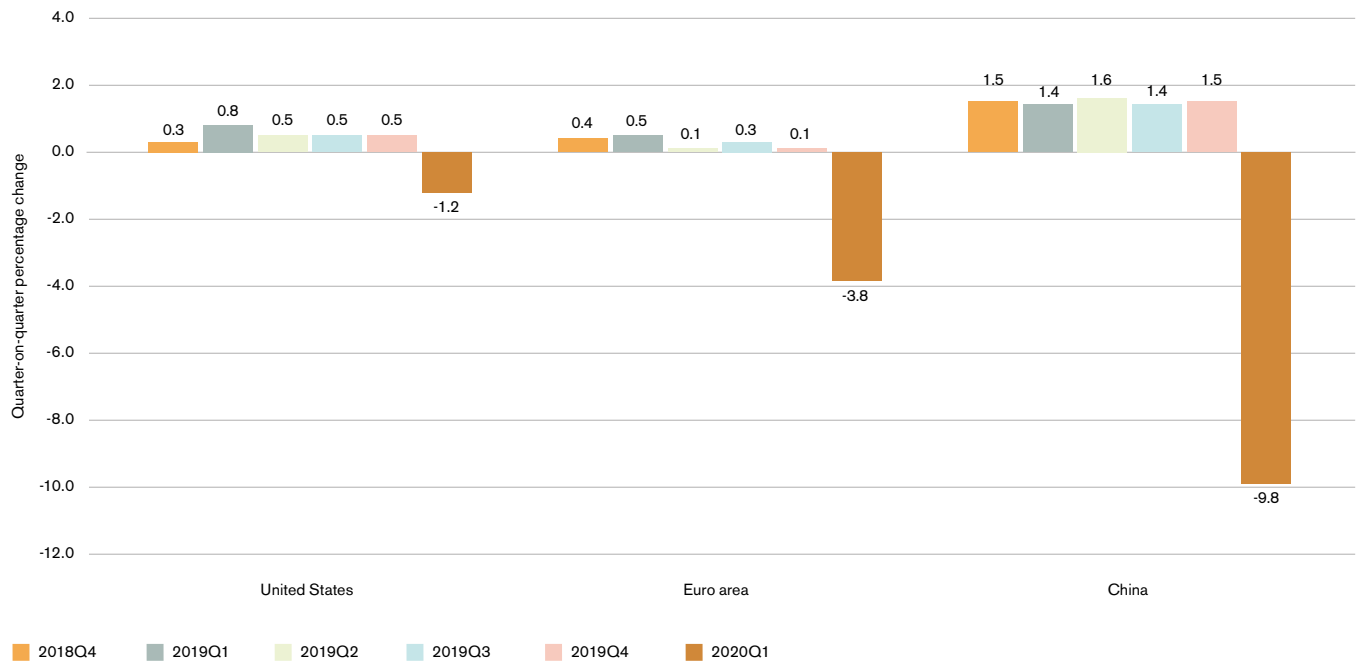

- Global commercial flights, including both passenger flights and air transport, were down by 74 per cent between 5 January and 18 April 2020.
- The decline suggests a sharp slowdown in both merchandise trade and commercial services trade since international flights carry a substantial amount of air cargo and are also closely linked to traded services such as travel and transport.
- Flights have rebounded 58 per cent up to mid-June 2020, possibly indicating the beginning of a recovery as measures to counter the pandemic have eased.

Outlook for 2020

In April 2020, WTO economists estimated that world trade would fall between 13 per cent and 32 per cent in 2020 as the COVID-19 pandemic disrupted normal economic activity and life around the world. Subsequent tracking of trade developments suggests that the decline may be closer to the optimistic scenario but worse outcomes are still possible if there is a resurgence of the virus.

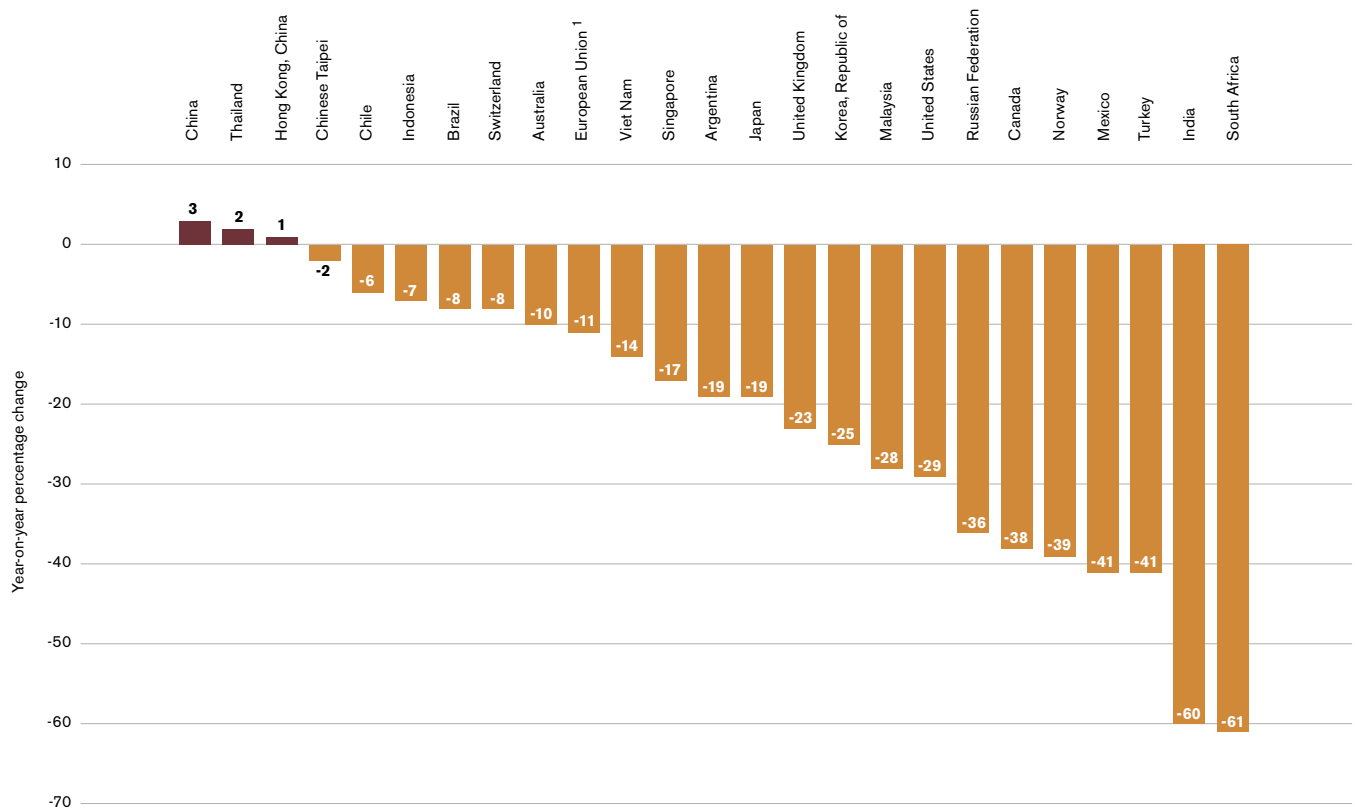
- The magnitude of the expected downturn in world trade will depend to a large extent on the amount of time it takes for the COVID-19 pandemic to be brought under control and for effective treatments to be found.
- China recorded a 9.8 per cent decline in GDP in the first quarter of 2020 compared with the previous quarter. This is equivalent to an annualized rate of -45 per cent.
- First quarter GDP growth for the United States in 2020 was -1.2 per cent (-4.8 per cent annualized) while GDP in the euro area was estimated at -3.8 per cent (-14.4 per cent annualized). Large declines are expected for both the United States and the euro area in the second quarter of 2020.

Merchandise exports were down sharply in most economies in April 2020 compared with the previous year.

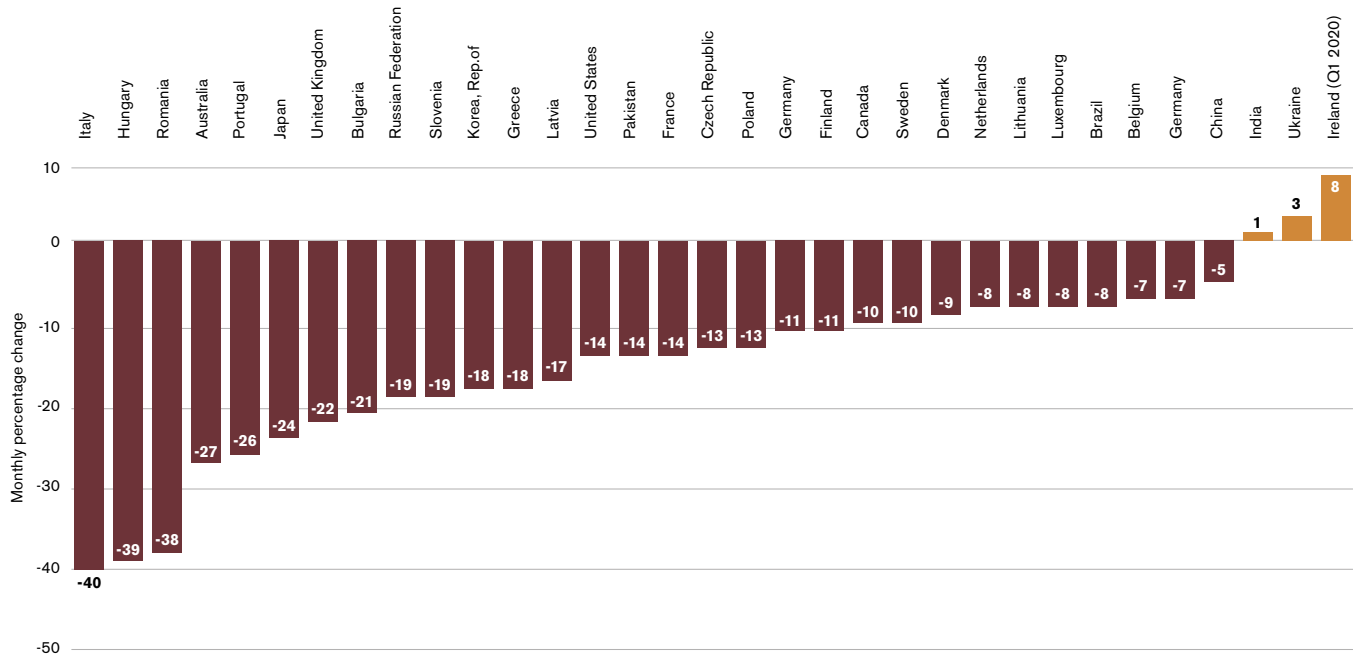
- Declines in merchandise exports of selected leading traders in April 2020 (year-on-year change) ranged from -2 per cent (Chinese Taipei) to -61 per cent (South Africa). Monthly merchandise trade statistics in current US dollar terms, are more timely than quarterly statistics in volume terms.
- Although certain Asian economies avoided declines in exports (in April 2020), their import growth remained negative. For example, imports of China and Thailand were down 14 per cent and 17 per cent, respectively, in April 2020.

Services are hit hard by the COVID-19 outbreak.

- Unlike goods, services cannot be produced, stored and sold at a later stage. Export revenues lost for cancelled flights, restaurant meals or hotel bookings are lost permanently and cannot be recovered. International travel, for personal or business reasons, air transport, and cultural, sporting and recreational activities are all linked. They account for more than 40 per cent of world services exports. These services have been directly affected by the COVID-19 pandemic due to travel restrictions at home and in the host countries for these activities, making it impossible for people to move, consume or supply services.
- In March 2020, services exports of leading traders dropped sharply, with Italy's exports down by 40 per cent compared with March 2019. On average, in these economies, which accounted for more than half of global services exports in 2019, exports were down by around 15 per cent in March 2020. April 2020 data show even more pronounced declines. In the United States, the leading services trader, exports were down by 14 per cent. In the United Kingdom, the second-largest exporter, the decline was 22 per cent, on a seasonally adjusted basis.
- Growth remained positive in countries where exports are dominated by IT services. In March 2020, the services exports of India and Ukraine were up by 1 per cent and 3 per cent respectively. In Ireland, data for the first quarter of 2020 show an increase of 8 per cent, supported by a rise of over 15 per cent in computer services exports in the first three months of 2020. IT services accounted for 51 per cent of Ireland's services exports in 2019.
- The COVID-19 crisis has enabled firms that have invested in digitalization to ensure productivity thanks to remote working. This trend, which was already under way before the pandemic, will further boost IT services thanks to emerging areas, such as cybersecurity infrastructure, cloud computing, development of services platforms and virtual workplaces.

Shifting patterns in trade

This chapter highlights shifting patterns in trade in a variety of sectors brought about by factors such as trade tensions, increasing demand for various products, the impact of digital technology, and the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Escalating trade tensions in 2019 contributed to a slowdown in the global economy, with lower levels of trading activity in sectors and products affected by these tensions.



The COVID-19 pandemic has demonstrated the importance of maintaining open supply chains for pharmaceutical products and medical devices, which are critical for tackling the virus.



Despite a 3 per cent decline in food prices in 2019, global food exports fell by only just under 1 per cent in value terms.



The pandemic has highlighted the limitations of existing statistical tools in measuring trade in goods related to combating COVID-19.



Increasing pressure from consumers to reduce waste and the use of products damaging to the environment led to greater demand for renewable energy goods and environmentally friendly goods such as wind turbines, solar panels and electric cars.



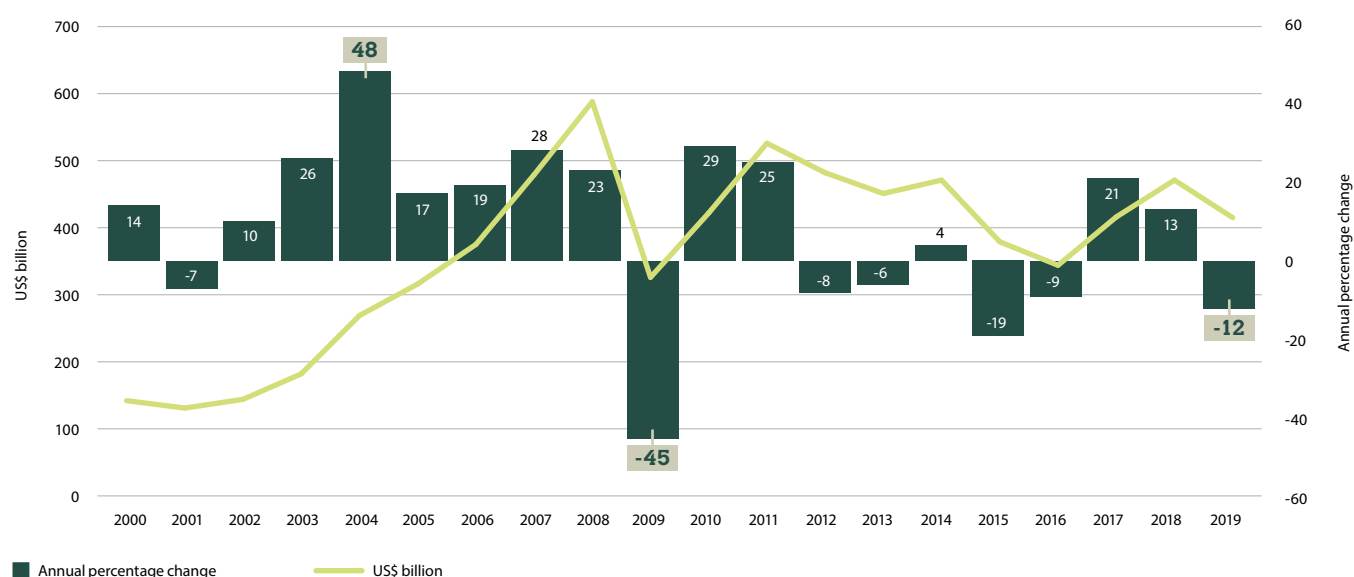
Services linked with goods, such as freight transport and manufacturing services, have been directly affected by growing trade tensions and the COVID-19 pandemic.

Merchandise trade

Iron and steel

Trade tensions contributed to a 12 per cent annual decline in iron and steel exports in 2019.

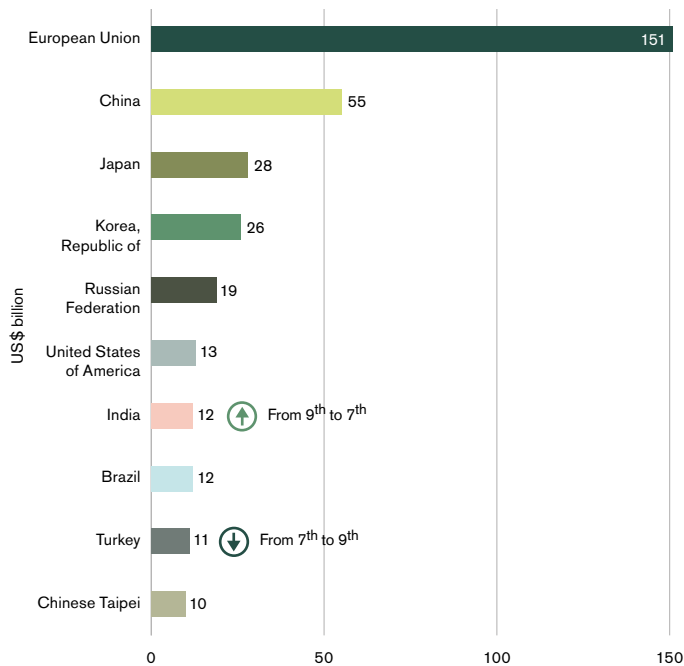

- World exports of iron and steel increased on average by 6 per cent per year from 2000 to 2019. The highest increase (+48 per cent) was recorded in 2004 during the 2000s commodities boom while the steepest decline was in 2009 in the aftermath of the financial crisis (-45 per cent).
- The 12 per cent decline in iron and steel exports in 2019 was the third steepest decline since 2000.

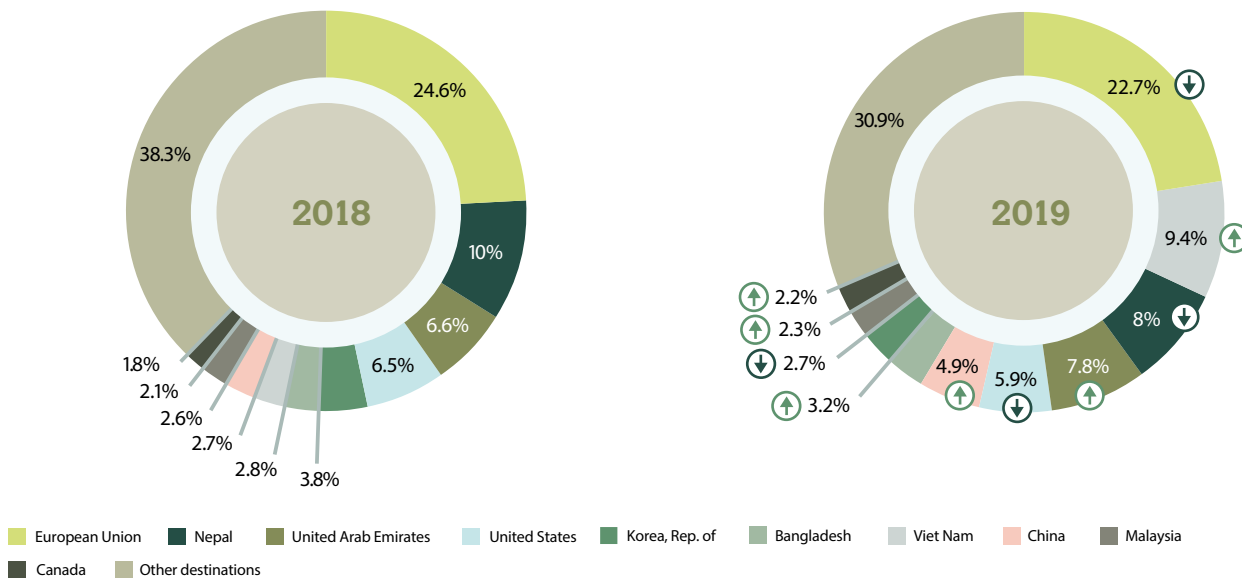

- The European Union remained the largest exporter of iron and steel in 2019. The value of its exports was almost three times higher than the second-largest exporter, China.
- All of the top ten exporters experienced a decline in exports in 2019, with Russia suffering the most (-21 per cent), followed by Chinese Taipei (-16 per cent), the United States (-14 per cent) and Turkey (-14 per cent).
- The ranking of the top ten exporters remained mostly unchanged. However, India moved up from ninth to seventh position in 2019, while Turkey went in the opposite direction.

- India's exports of iron and steel declined the least among the top ten exporters, falling by only 1 per cent in 2019. India saw a major decline in exports to some of its main destinations, such as Nepal (-21 per cent), the United States (-10 per cent) and the European Union (-9 per cent), but exports increased significantly

for other partners, such as Viet Nam (+240 per cent), China (+84 per cent), Canada (+22 per cent) and the United Arab Emirates (+17 per cent).

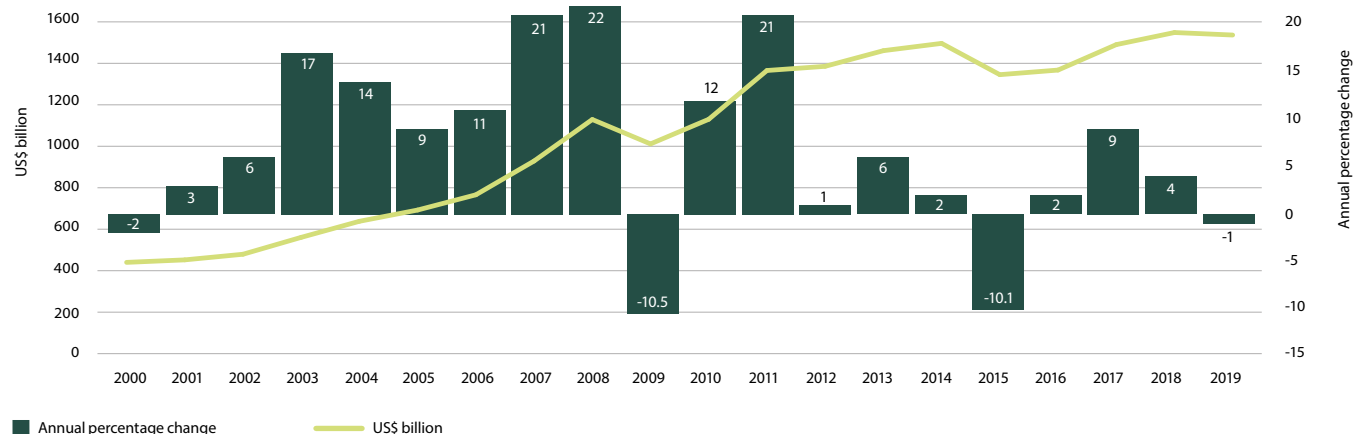
World trade in food products

World exports of food increased on average by 7 per cent per year between 2000 and 2019.

(US\$ billion and annual percentage change)



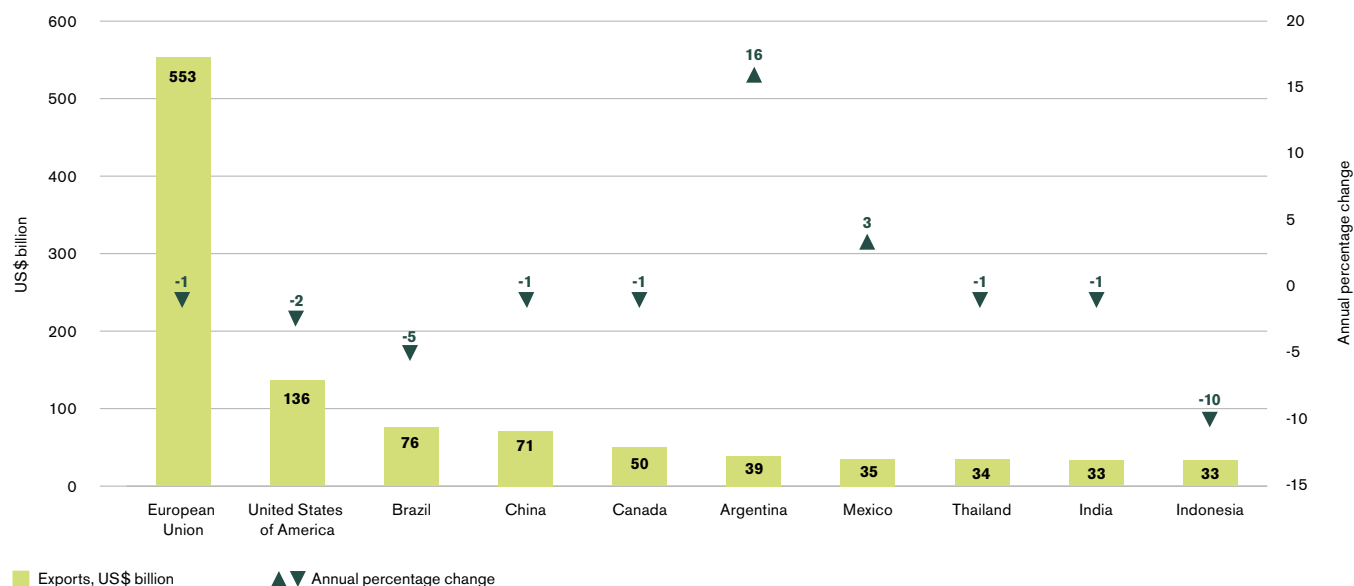

- Food prices fell by 3 per cent in 2019, leading to a 1 per cent decline in world exports of food. This compares with 4 per cent growth in 2018.
- Since 2000, the largest increase in world exports of food was recorded in 2008 – following the 2007–08 world food price crisis - (+22 per cent). The largest decline was in 2009 (-10.5 per cent).

(US\$ billion, annual percentage change)

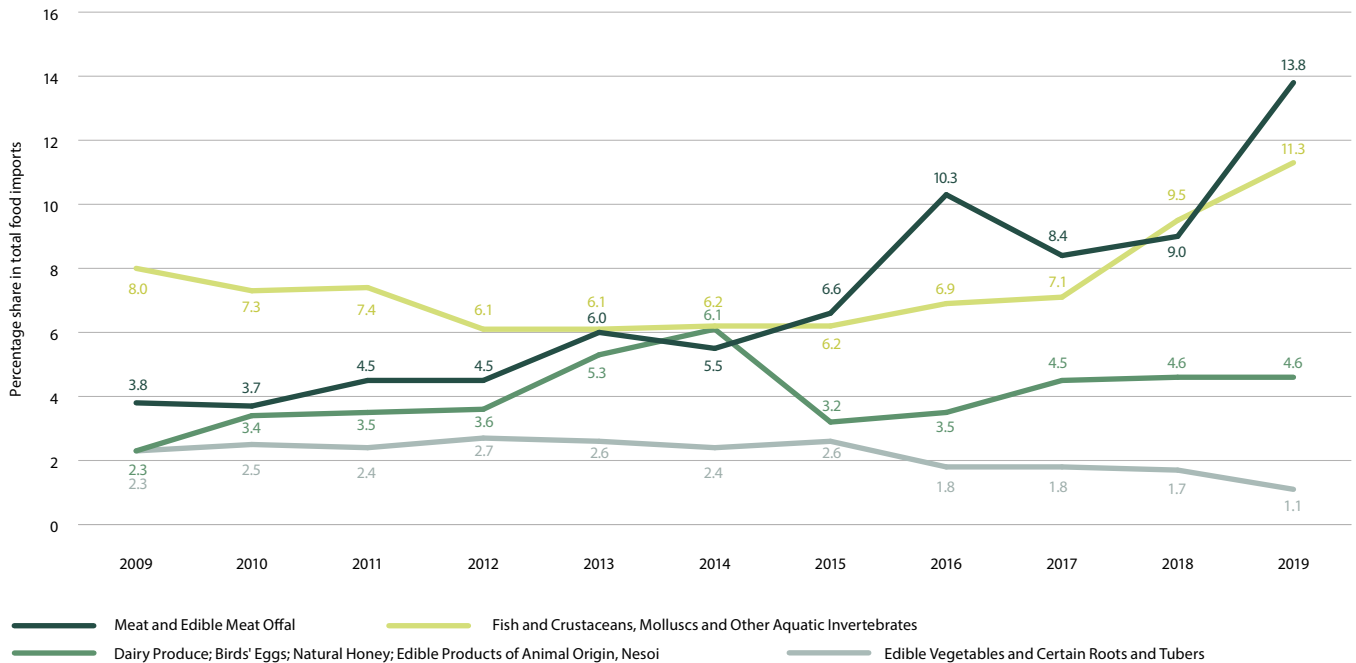

- Food exports from eight of the top ten exporters declined in 2019, with Indonesian exports seeing the biggest fall (-10 per cent). This was partly due to a 31 per cent drop in food exports to India. Argentina's exports grew the most, climbing by 16 per cent in 2019, due partly to a 51 per cent increase in exports of cereals to Viet Nam.

China's imports of meat products have increased significantly over the past decade.

- Chinese imports of meat increased by 71 per cent in 2019, totalling US\$ 19 billion (up from US\$ 11 billion in 2018). Imports of frozen bovine meat grew by 70 per cent (rising from US\$ 5 billion to US\$ 8 billion). Imports of pork more than doubled, from US\$ 2 billion in 2018 to US\$ 5 billion in 2019. The steep rise in these imports is mostly due to an increase in demand from more affluent buyers looking for higher quality. A fall in domestic production of pork due to African Swine Fever in 2019 also led to an increase in prices.
- In terms of Chinese food imports overall, the share of meat increased from 3.8 per cent in 2009 to 13.8 per cent in 2019 while fish/crustaceans grew from 8 per cent to 11.3 per cent over the same period. The category of “dairy produce; birds’ eggs; natural honey etc.” also increased in terms of total share but vegetables declined from 2.3 per cent in 2009 to 1.1 per cent in 2019.

Fish and fish products

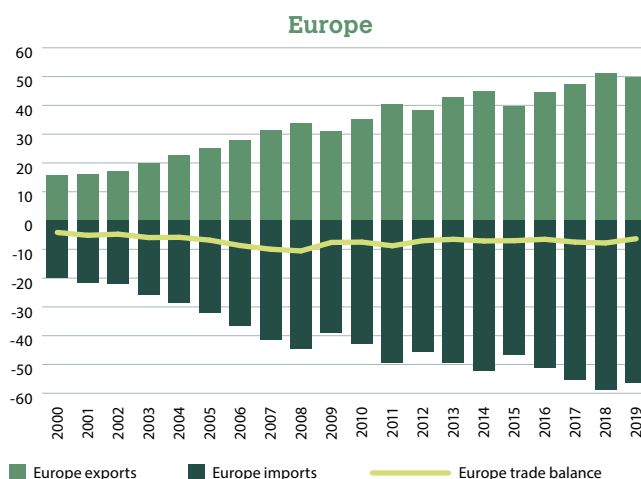
Imports of fish and fish products in North America and Europe declined in 2019.

World imports of fish and fish products reached an estimated US\$ 146 billion in 2019.

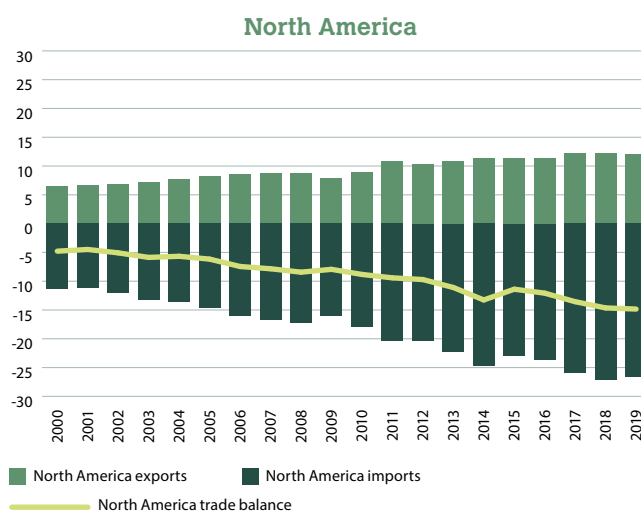

(US\$ billion)

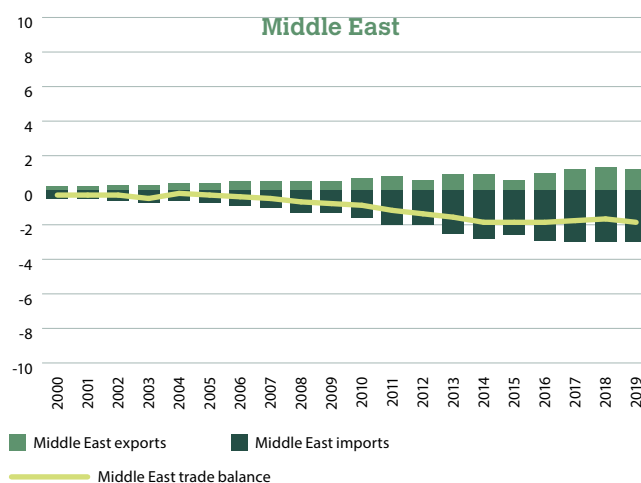
- Europe continues to be the largest importer of fish and fish products but its share of total world imports fell from 41.4 per cent in 2010 to 39.0 per cent in 2019. The value of European imports dropped by 3 per cent in 2019, partly due to a fall in prices for several imported fish species.



- North American imports of fish and fish products fell 2 per cent in 2019, partly as a result of US-China trade tensions. Crustaceans represent the largest share of US fish imports. Imports of crustaceans from China fell 84 per cent in 2019, due to increased US tariffs imposed as of September 2018.



- The Middle East has the smallest share of world imports of fish and fish products but demand has risen in recent years. Population growth, in particular for foreign residents, has contributed to this increasing demand, which has grown at an average annual rate of 7 per cent per year since 2010.

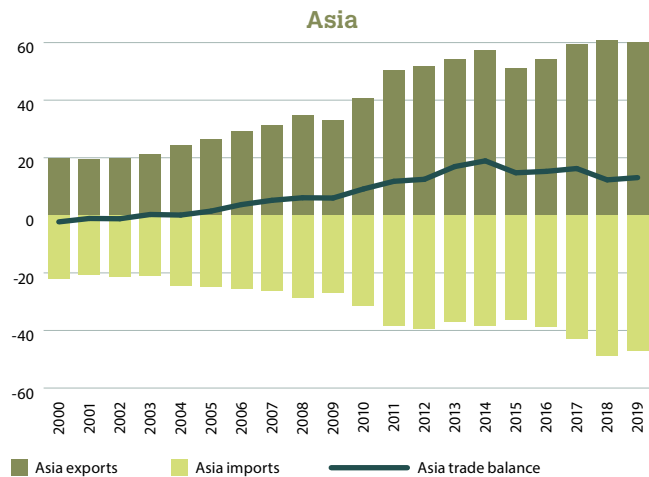

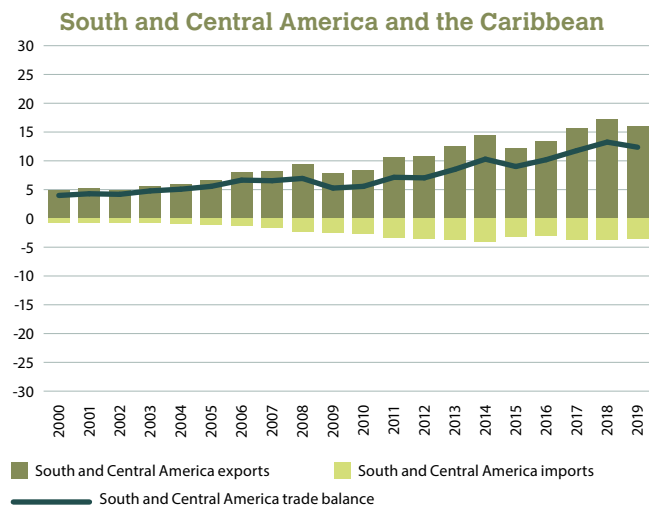
Exports of fish and fish products from several regions, such as Asia, South and Central America and the Caribbean, and Africa, have seen a steady increase since 2000, helping these regions achieve positive trade balances.

World exports of fish and fish products reached US\$ 151 billion in 2019.

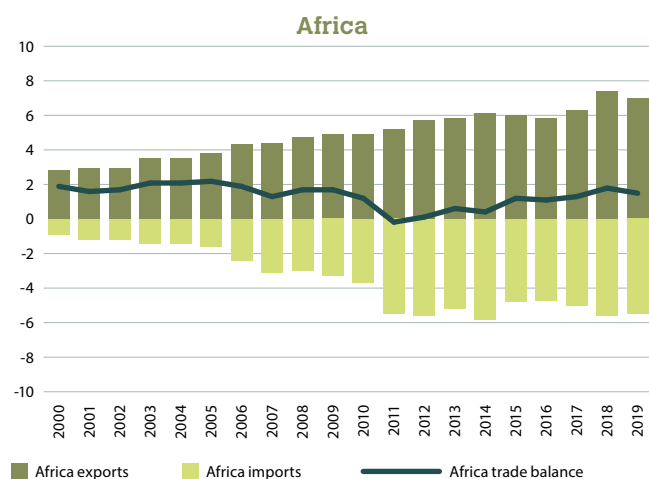

- Asia continues to be the largest exporter of fish and fish products, with China maintaining its position as the top exporter globally. An improvement in living standards in China has also resulted in a dramatic increase in demand for imports of fish and fish products. India has benefited the most from this increase in demand, with its exports of fish and fish products to China reaching over US\$ 1 billion in 2019, compared with US\$ 0.5 billion in 2018.



- South and Central America and the Caribbean increased its share in world exports of fish and fish products from 8.2 per cent in 2010 to 10.6 per cent in 2019. Chile was the region's leading exporter, although it saw a slight decline of 2 per cent. Ecuador, the second-largest exporter in the region, increased its exports by 19 per cent in 2019, with exports to China more than doubling.



- Africa's share of world exports of fish and fish products fell to 4.7 per cent in 2019 from a high of 6.0 per cent recorded in 2003 and 2009. Mauritania had a particularly strong performance in 2018 (latest year for which data is available), with its exports growing by 58 per cent. This is partly due to the country's participation in UNCTAD's Port Management Programme helping it to boost its fisheries industry.

- China has been the world's leading trader in fish and fish products since 2012, mostly due to increasing exports. China's import demand has risen steeply since 2018.
- Sweden improved its world ranking from 11th to sixth position, with France, Germany and Italy falling in the rankings.
- India rose nine places between 2010 and 2019, rising to 15th position, while Ecuador moved up seven places to 20th position. Both countries benefited from a significant increase in exports of fish and fish products to China, especially in 2018 and 2019.
- Negotiations on reducing fisheries subsidies are ongoing at the WTO. The goal of WTO members is to conclude an agreement in 2020 on eliminating subsidies for illegal, unreported and unregulated fishing and on prohibiting certain forms of fisheries subsidies that contribute to overcapacity and overfishing, with special and differential treatment for developing countries.

Renewable-energy goods

Trade in renewable-energy goods has seen a steep increase in recent years. Exports of wind-energy goods increased 14-fold between 2000 and 2019.

(US\$ million)



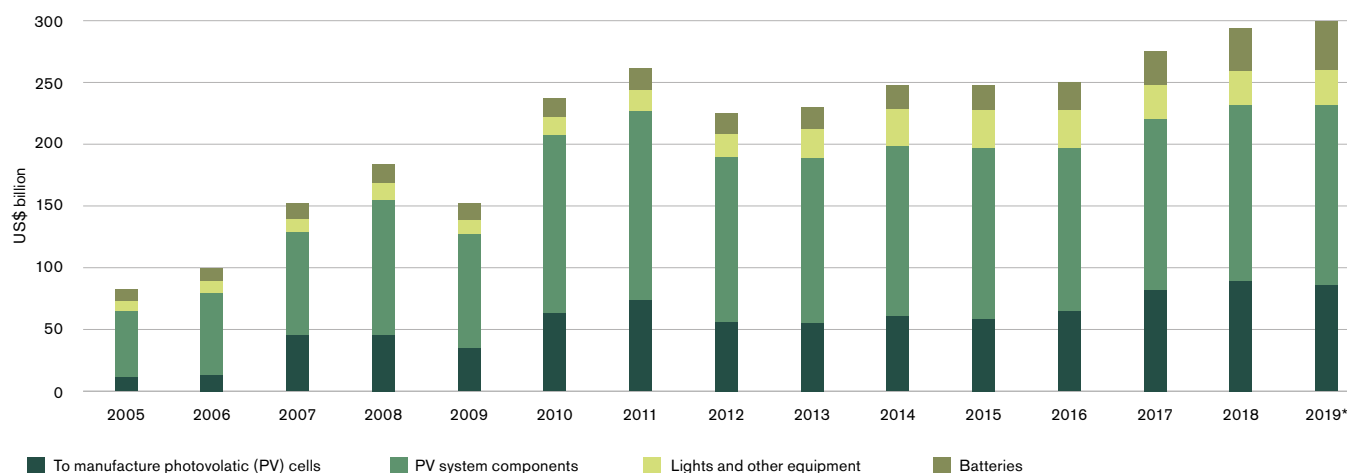

- World exports of wind turbines, including parts and accessories, grew on average by 15 per cent per year between 2000 and 2019, rising from US\$ 505 million to US\$ 7,270 million.
- In 2019, exports of wind turbines climbed by 26 per cent. This is mainly due to a 74 per cent jump in Denmark's exports of these products (with a large increase in Danish exports to the Netherlands). Denmark is traditionally the world's leading supplier of wind turbines, including parts and accessories. In 2000, its share in world exports stood at 85 per cent. In 2019 its share declined to 42 per cent but it was still the world's top exporter followed by Germany (28 per cent share), the Netherlands (13 per cent) and China (13 per cent).
- The main importers of wind turbines in 2019 were Norway (13 per cent share in world imports), the Netherlands (11 per cent), Mexico (7 per cent), Australia (7 per cent) and the United Kingdom (7 per cent).

Solar-energy powered goods

Exports of solar-energy powered goods and related products have doubled since 2005.

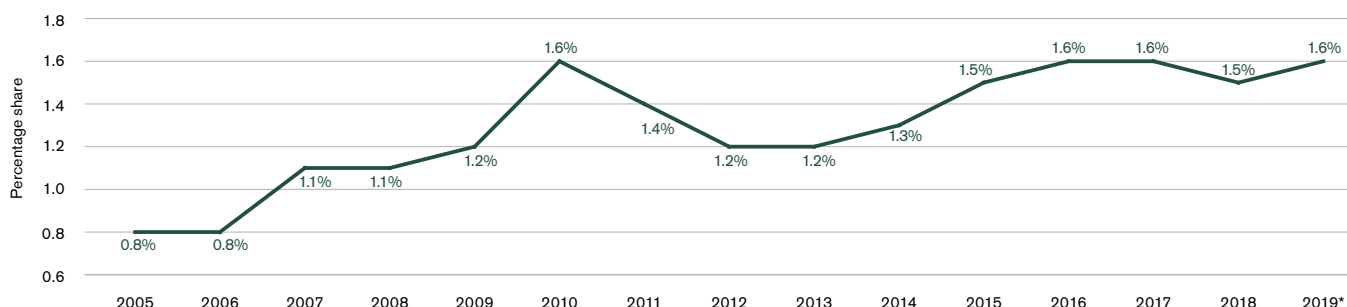

- A key target of the UN Sustainable Development Goals is to substantially increase the share of renewable energy in world energy use by 2030.
- World exports of solar-energy powered goods and related products increased from US\$ 82 billion in 2005 to US\$ 300 billion in 2019. Their export value increased by an annual average of 10 per cent.
- Photovoltaic system components constituted the largest share (49 per cent) in exports of solar-energy powered goods and related products in 2019, followed by products to manufacture photovoltaic cells (29 per cent share) and batteries (13 per cent). Lights and other equipment constituted a 10 per cent share.

(Percentage share in world merchandise exports)



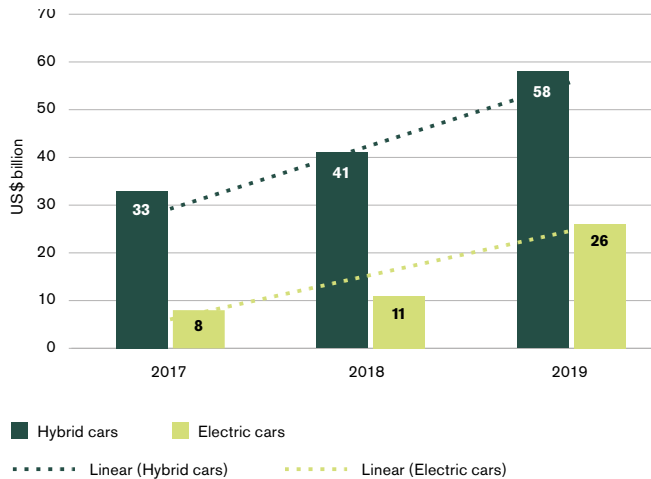

- The share of solar-energy powered goods and related products in world merchandise exports doubled between 2005 and 2019, rising from 0.8 per cent in 2005 to 1.6 per cent in 2019.
- The top three exporters in 2019 were China (28 per cent share in world exports), Japan (10 per cent) and the United States (10 per cent). The top importers were the United States (16 per cent share in world imports), China (14 per cent) and Chinese Taipei (8 per cent).

Hybrid and electric cars

Global exports of hybrid and electric cars increased by almost 60 per cent in 2019.

- World exports of electric and hybrid cars totalled US\$ 84 billion in 2019 – an increase of almost 60 per cent compared with 2018. Exports of electric cars more than doubled over this period.
- Hybrid cars had an 8 per cent share in world exports of passenger cars in 2019 (up from 6 per cent in 2018). Electric cars had a 4 per cent share (up from 2 per cent).
- Trade for all passenger cars declined by 1 per cent in 2019.

(Percentage share in world exports)

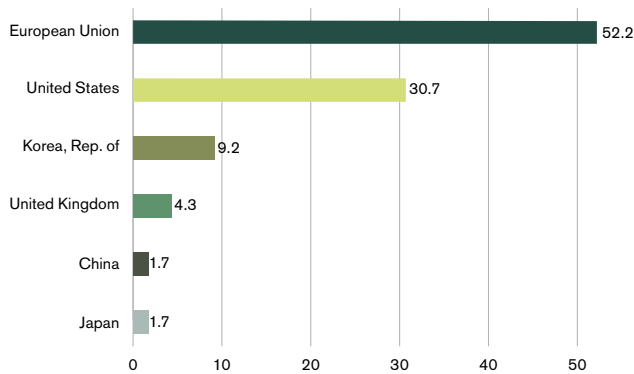
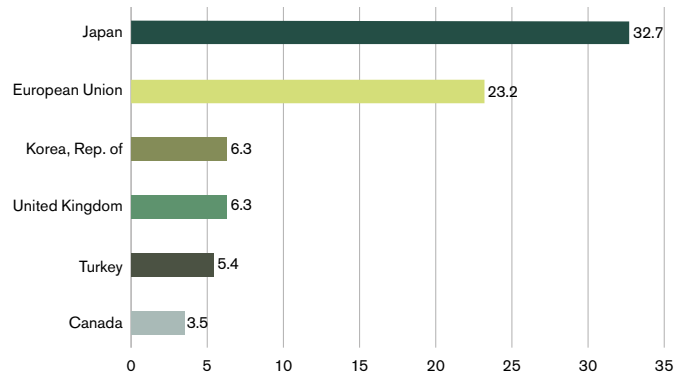

- The top exporters of hybrid cars in 2019 were Japan (32.7 per cent share in world exports), the European Union (23.2 per cent) and the Republic of Korea (6 per cent). For electric cars, the leading exporters were the European Union (52.2 per cent share), the United States (30.7 per cent) and the Republic of Korea (9.2 per cent).
- The major importers of hybrid cars in 2019 were the European Union (44 per cent share in world imports) followed by the United States (23 per cent) and China (9 per cent). Electric cars were mostly imported by the European Union (51 per cent share), Norway (12 per cent) and China (10 per cent).

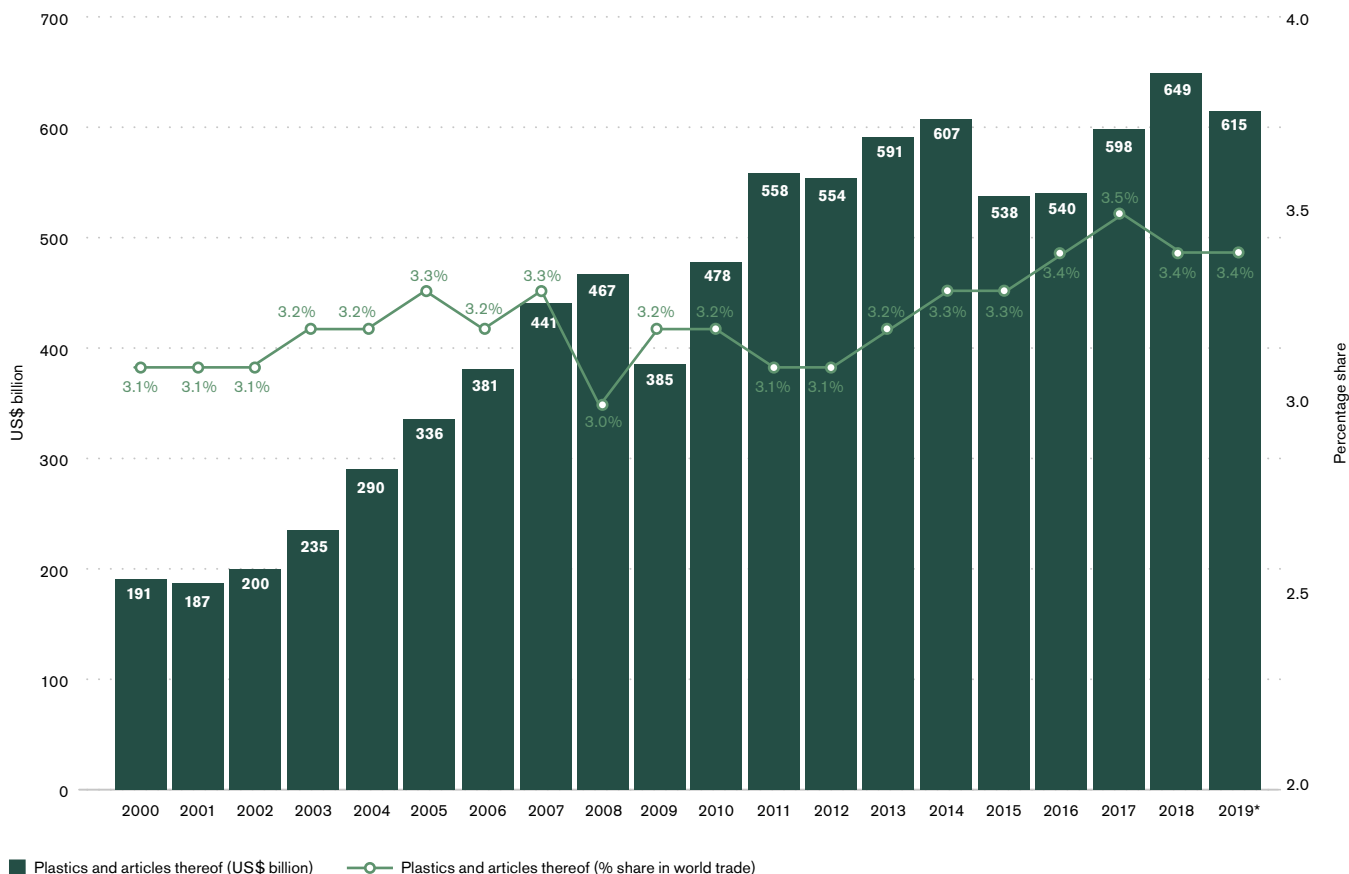
Plastics

Exports of plastics have more than trebled since 2000. In 2019, a slight decline was recorded. This may be partly due to the global call to reduce the use of plastics.

(US\$ billion and percentage share)

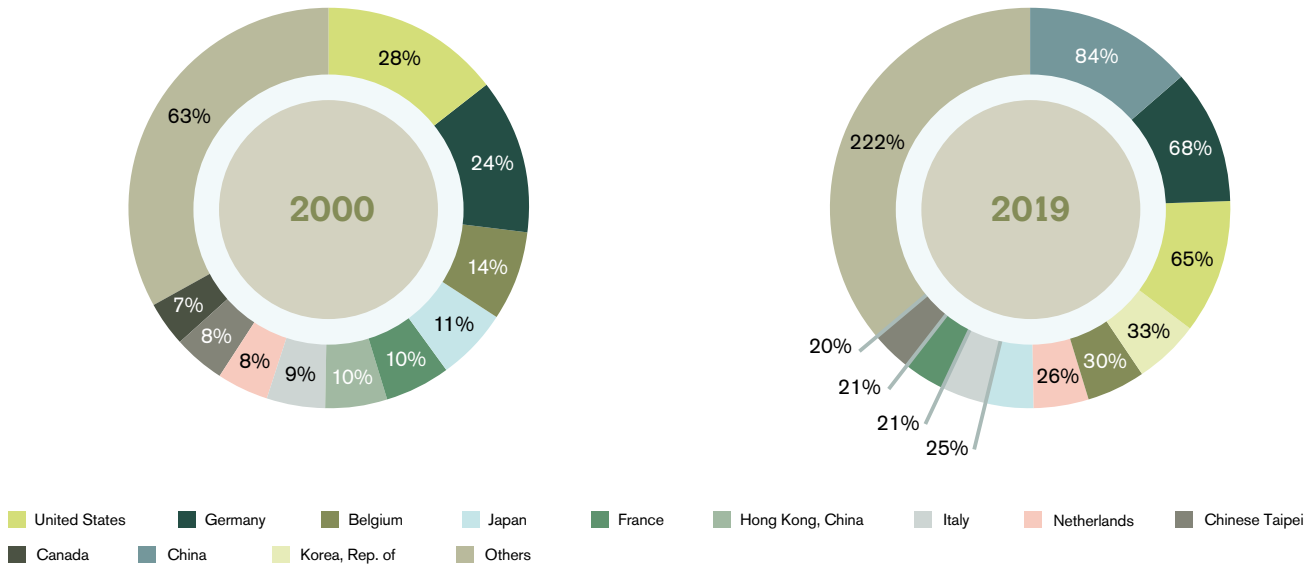

- World exports of plastics and related articles increased on average by 6 per cent annually between 2000 and 2019, rising from US\$ 193 billion in 2000 to US\$ 615 billion in 2019.
- The share of plastics and related articles in total world exports increased from 3.1 per cent in 2000 to 3.4 per cent in 2019.
- In 2019, exports decreased by 5 per cent – declining more quickly than total merchandise exports (-3 per cent). Partly due to international trade tensions.

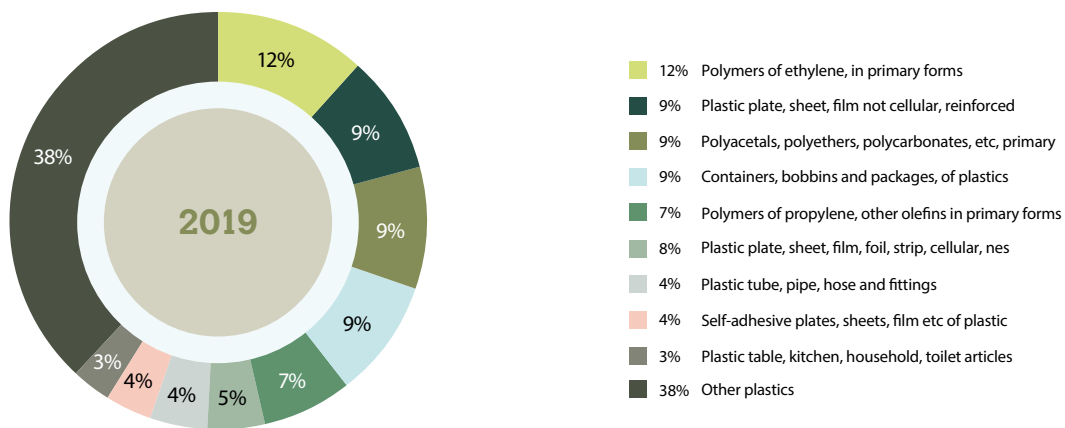

- In 2019, China was the world's top exporter of plastics, with a 14 per cent share in world trade. In 2000, China had not even been among the top ten exporters.
- The United States was the top exporter in 2000, falling to third position in 2019. Germany remained the second-largest exporter.

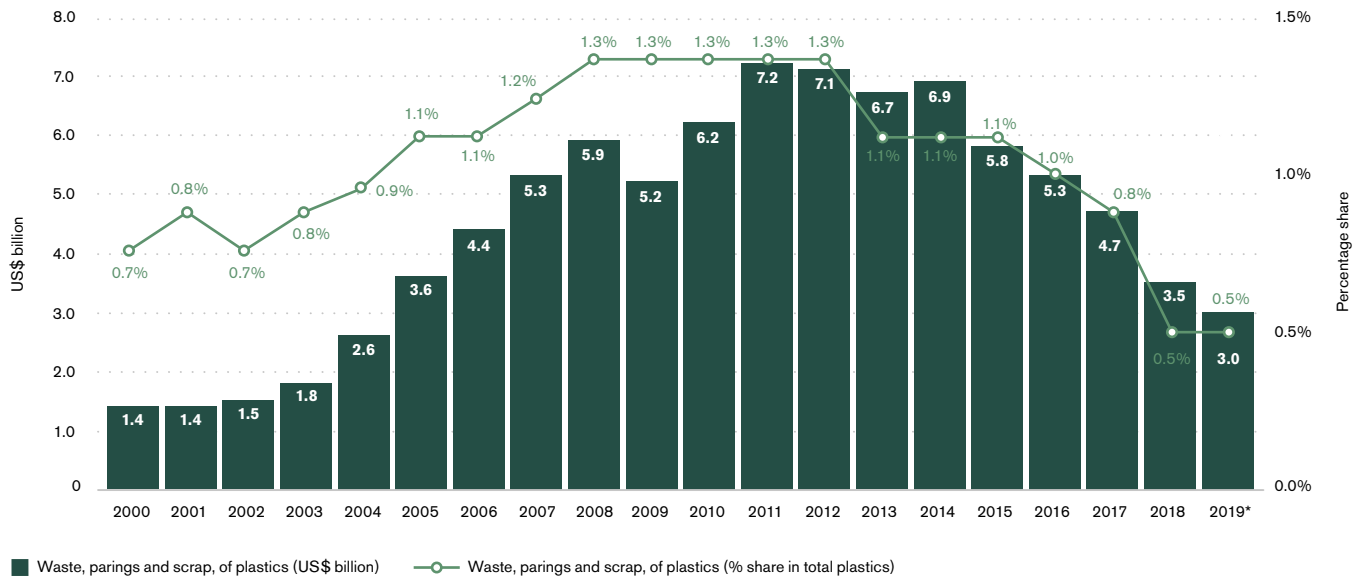

- In 2019, the product with the highest share (12 per cent) in world exports of plastics was “polymers of ethylene, in primary forms”, the plastic most commonly used nowadays, primarily for packaging. This was followed by “plastic plate, sheet, film not cellular, reinforced”, mostly used in construction, with a share of 9 per cent, and “polyacetals, polyethers, polycarbonates, etc, primary”, widely used in the automotive and consumer electronics industry, with a share of 9 per cent.

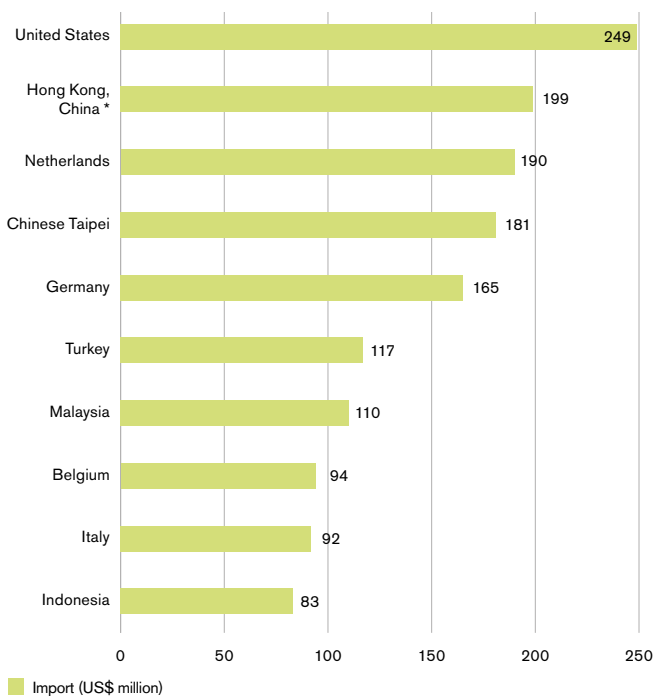

- World exports of plastic waste (“waste, parings and scrap of plastics”) reached a peak of US\$ 7.2 billion in 2011 (up from US\$ 1.4 billion in 2000). Since then, it has consistently declined – falling to a value of US\$ 3.0 billion in 2019.
- The share of plastic waste in total exports of plastics has fallen from a peak of 1.3 per cent in 2011 to 0.5 per cent in 2019.

- The top importers of plastic waste in 2019 were the United States (US\$ 249 million), Hong Kong (China) (US\$ 199 million; mainly for re-export) and the Netherlands (US\$ 190 million). Up to 2017, China was the top importer of plastic waste (totalling US\$ 3,259 million in 2017) but since 2018 it has dramatically reduced its imports, to US\$ 49 million in 2018 and US\$ 0.5 million in 2019.

Trade in services

Freight transport services

Global freight transport services decline as merchandise trade contracts.

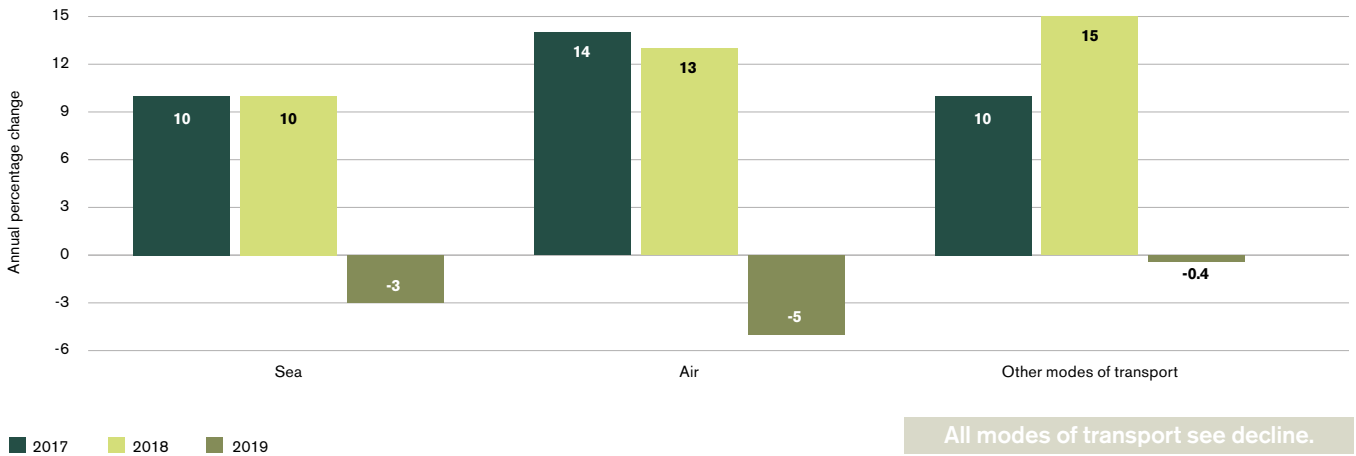
- Freight transport services tend to mirror closely developments in merchandise trade. Globally, all modes of freight transport services, such as sea, air, road, and rail, representing 47.3 per cent of transport exports, declined

by 2 per cent in 2019, to US\$ 486 billion. This represents an export loss of US\$ 13 billion for transport operators, following growth in 2017 and 2018.

 (Annual percentage change)

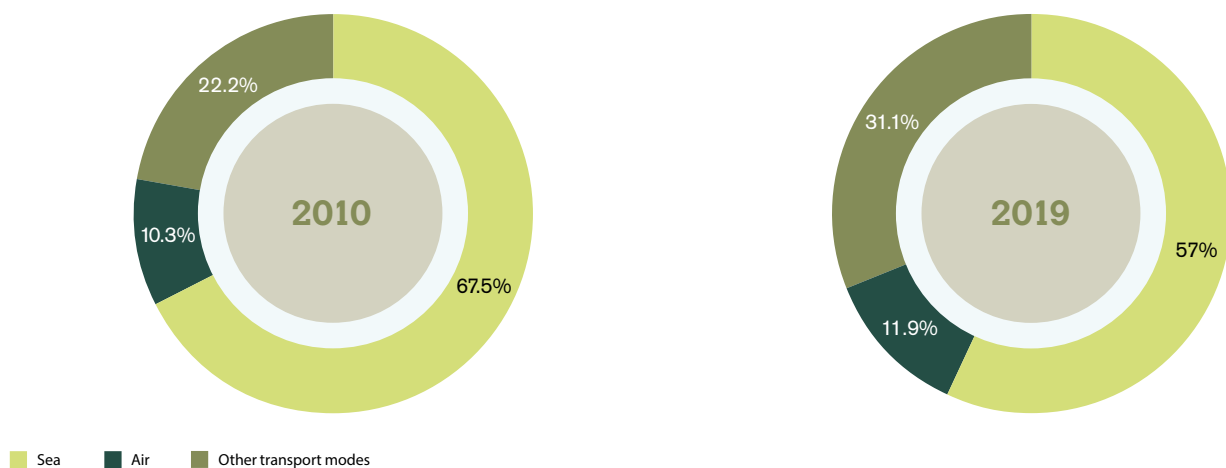


- In 2019, world maritime freight transport services decreased by 3 per cent, to US\$ 277 billion. Several leading traders experienced declines. Singapore, the top global exporter, saw exports contract by 5 per cent, Japan by 14 per cent and the Republic of Korea by 7 per cent.

In Denmark and Germany, maritime freight transport fell by 2 per cent, and in Norway by 3 per cent. In Africa, Egypt's exports dropped by 37 per cent, hitting the lowest level since 2009, despite increased activity in the Suez Canal.

 (Percentage)



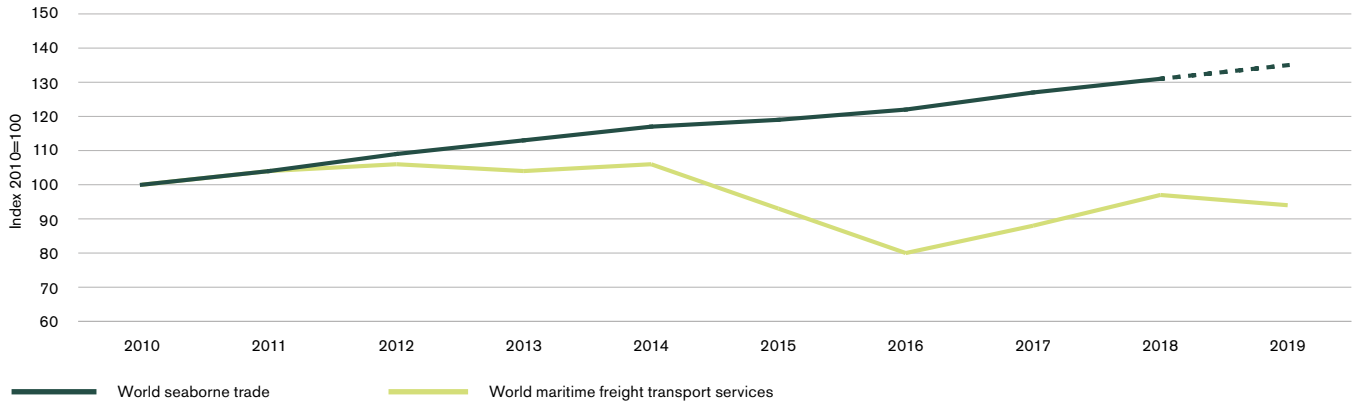
- In the last decade, the share of maritime transport in total freight transport services has contracted by more than ten percentage points globally, from 67.5 per cent in 2010 to

57.0 per cent in 2019, reflecting lower shipping costs due to overcapacity and a weak global demand.

Maritime freight transport services have declined despite rising volumes of goods shipped.

(Index 2010 = 100)

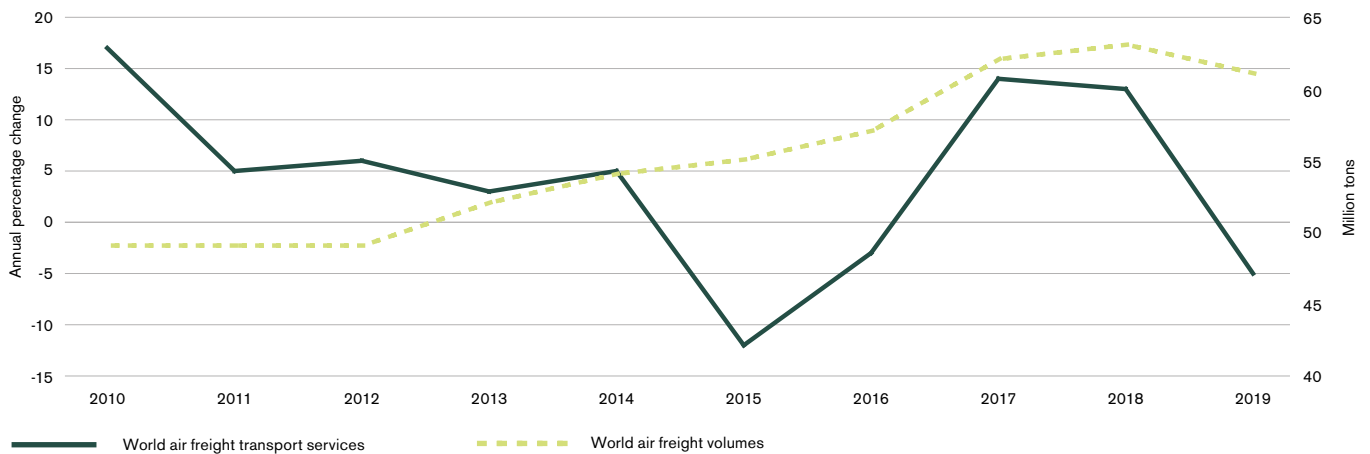

- In 2019, global exports of airfreight transport services fell by 5 per cent, reflecting a contraction in airlines' cargo yields and representing the first decline in airfreight volumes since 2012. In the United States, which accounts for one-quarter of global air freight transport services, exports fell by 5 per cent. In Russia, exports dropped by 26 per cent.

- Freight transport services via other modes, such as road, rail and inland waterways, declined by just 0.4 per cent. Freight transport services through these other modes have risen by 5 per cent on average per year since 2010. The European Union accounts for more than two-thirds of the global total. Within the EU, goods are transported mainly by road (52.4 per cent in 2018), followed by rail transport (13 per cent) and inland waterways (4.1 per cent).¹ In 2019, EU freight transport services exports remained static.
- The decline in world merchandise exports in the first quarter of 2020 (-5 per cent) due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and the expected sharper contraction in merchandise trade in the second quarter of the year, will inevitably translate into a decline in freight transport services in 2020, in particular for maritime transport. This will be the third decline for freight transport services in the past ten years. However, its extent is difficult to predict.

Manufacturing services

Global exports of manufacturing services fall as production slows.

- World exports of “manufacturing services on physical inputs owned by others” dropped by 2 per cent in 2019, compared with a 16 per cent rise in 2018. These services cover activities such as assembly, processing, packaging and labelling on a contract basis. They are intimately linked with global value chains, as economies have increasingly delocalised production to third countries, benefiting from cheaper costs or skilled labour.
- Trade tensions have disrupted global value chains involving Asia, affecting product assembly tasks. The decline

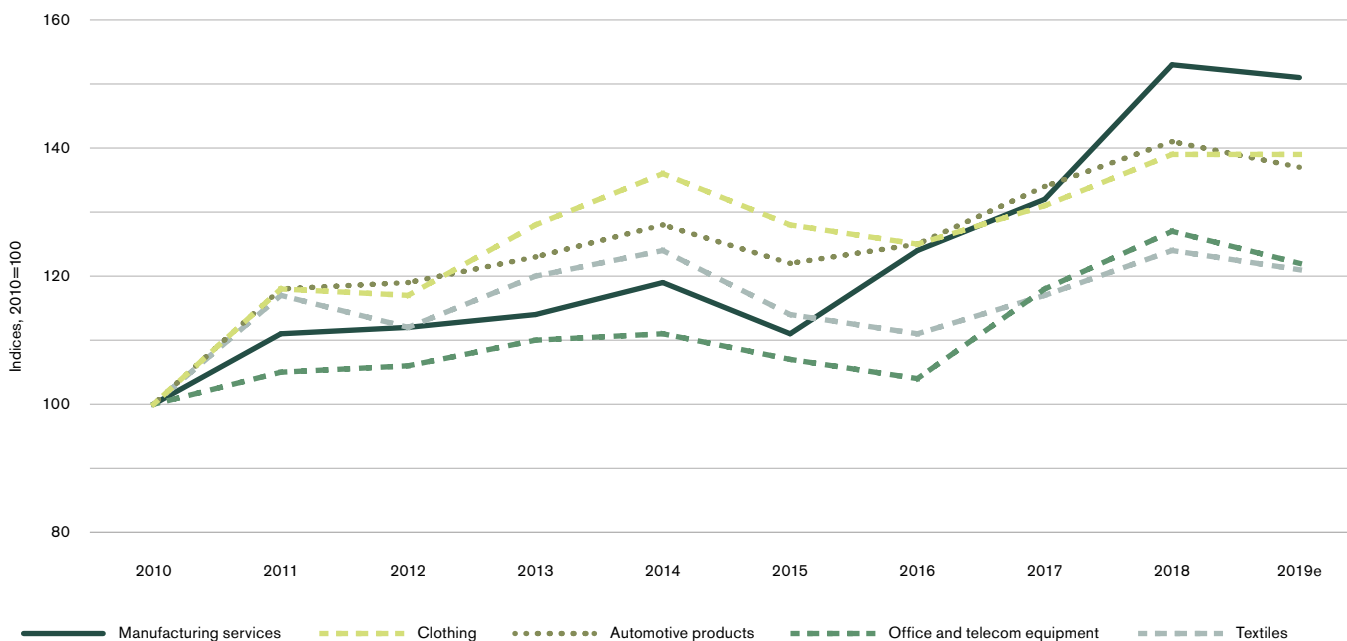
in manufacturing services for intermediate and final goods is linked to the lower demand for office and telecom equipment and automotive products due to an increase in trade restrictions.

- The economic slowdown, coupled with weaker demand, has taken a toll on the manufacturing of textiles and clothing, whose exports stagnated in 2019. These sectors are part of fashion value chains, in which the production of garments takes place in various countries, thus affecting exports of manufacturing services.

(indices, 2010 = 100)



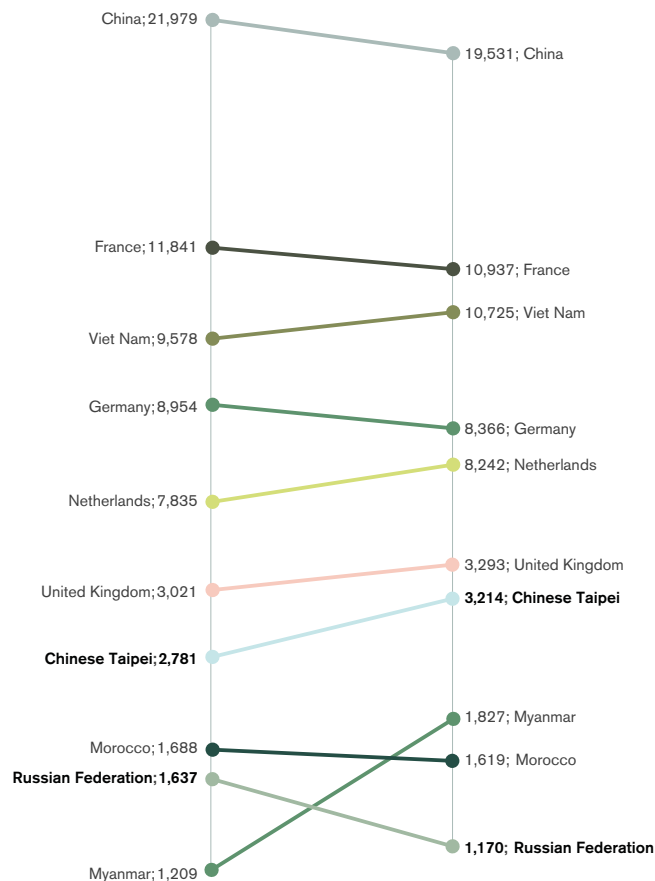
Twenty-one out of the 25 top exporters of manufacturing services saw exports decline or stagnate in 2019.

- Exports of manufacturing services for the top exporters either declined or stagnated in 2019. Chinese exports decreased by 11 per cent. This is partly due to trade tensions. However, since 2015, China's exports of

manufacturing services have been declining by 1 per cent on average per year as some of its processing activities in value chains have been transferred to neighbouring countries, such as Viet Nam or Myanmar.

- Viet Nam saw its exports of manufacturing services increase by 11 per cent in 2019. Considerable foreign direct investment from leading firms and manufacturers of electronic goods has allowed Viet Nam to specialise in the assembly of parts, components and finished goods.² In 2019, Viet Nam's exports of office and telecom equipment increased by 19 per cent, mostly due to the increase in exports of computers and electronic parts. Viet Nam also became the third-largest global exporter of mobile phones after China and Hong Kong, China.³
- In Europe, France and Germany recorded the sharpest falls in manufacturing services exports in 2019 (23% and 16% respectively), mostly linked to automotive products. The Netherlands saw its export of manufacturing services increase by 5 per cent, possibly due to a surge in exports of medical supplies and orthopaedic appliances.
- Despite uncertainties caused by leaving the European Union, the United Kingdom saw exports of manufacturing services increase by 9 per cent in 2019, driven by exports of computer and electronics and other machinery to the United States and Germany.
- In Africa, exports of manufacturing services from Morocco fell by 4 per cent in 2019, following an 18 per cent increase in 2018. Morocco's participation in the production of components and assembly of final goods in automotive value chains resulted in 2 per cent growth in exports of these products, but its clothing exports contracted by 5 per cent, negatively affecting its total exports of manufacturing services.
- Russia's exports of manufacturing services contracted by 28 per cent in 2019, the steepest decline among the top 25 exporters of manufacturing services, due to a reduction of 22 per cent in its exports of iron and steel.

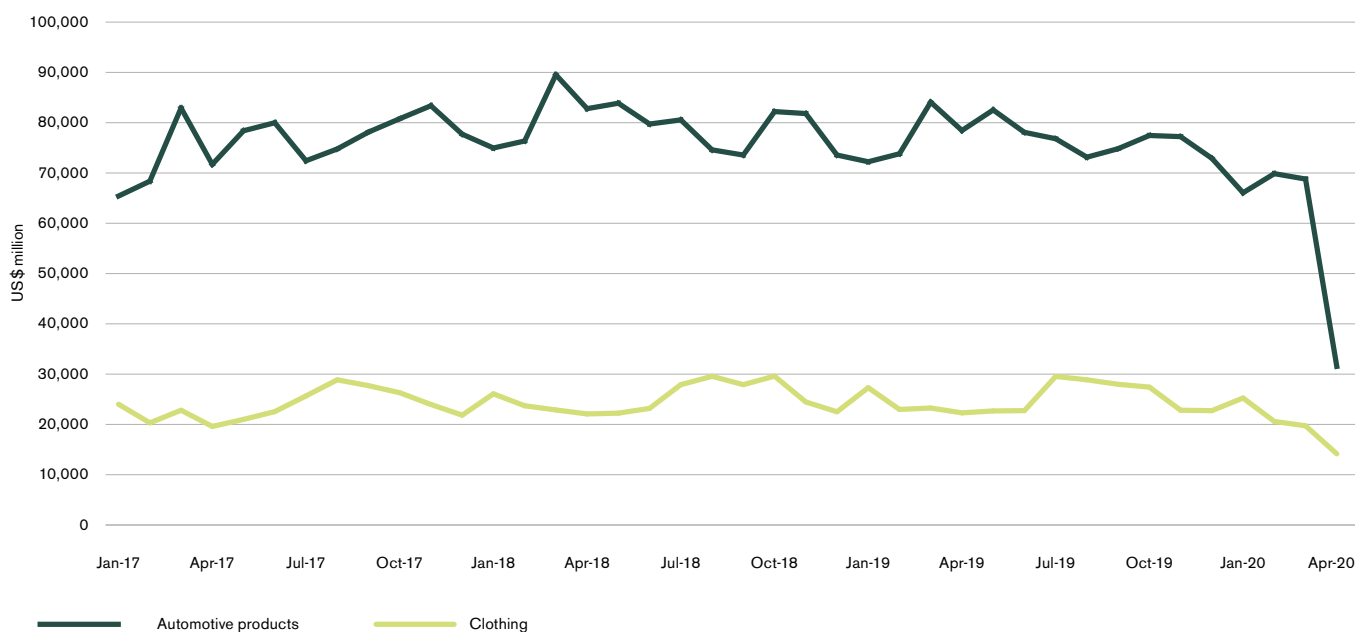

Disruption in global value chains and lower demand for many goods due to the COVID-19 pandemic is expected to have a negative impact on manufacturing services in 2020.

- Preliminary data points to a contraction of 9 per cent in trade in manufactured goods in the first quarter of 2020. Exports of automotive products and clothing have declined by 12 per cent and office and telecom equipment by 4 per cent.⁴
- Imports of automotive products contracted by 60 per cent in April 2020 due to the closure of automotive assembly plants in Europe and North America and a decline in the purchasing of vehicles.⁵
- Trade in electronic goods decreased by 2.4 per cent year-on-year in April 2020. In the mobile phone sector, leading brands transferred production to various providers of manufacturing services amid the tightening of confinement measures. However, strict lockdown measures imposed in the Republic of Korea disrupted the supply of core inputs for the assembly of mobile phones, having a negative impact on the provision of manufacturing services.⁶
- Preliminary estimates show that global demand for clothing decreased by 37 per cent in April 2020, in year-on-year terms. Export orders of garments were cancelled, severely affecting providers of manufacturing services to the clothing industry. In Bangladesh, where clothing accounts for 33 per cent of total exports, cancellations amounted to US\$ 3.18 billion in April, with exports 81 per cent lower than in April 2019.⁷

(US\$ million)



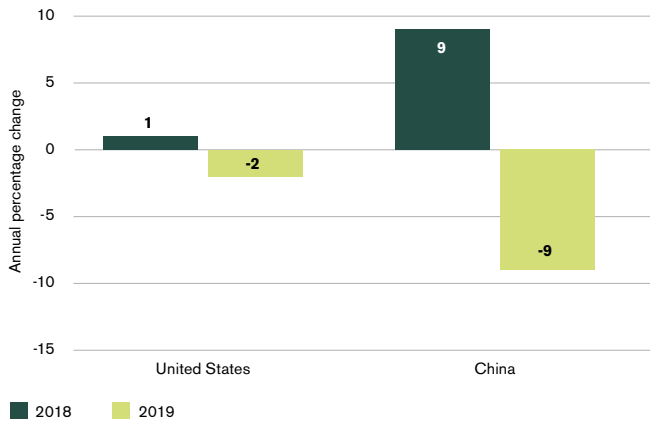

Travel

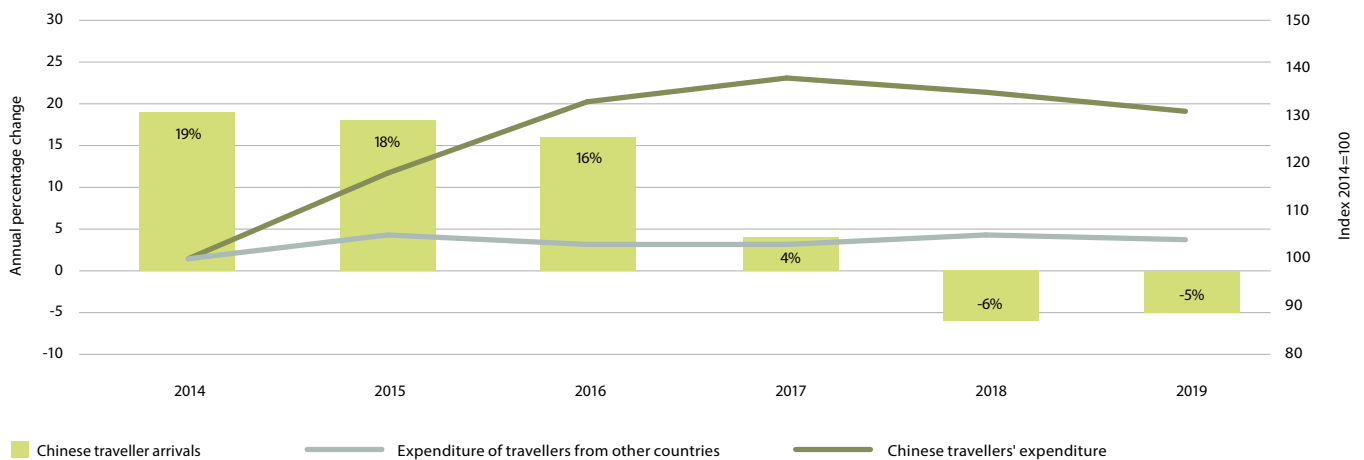
Tourism declines amid trade tensions and COVID-19 pandemic.

- The global economic slowdown resulting from trade tensions and the COVID-19 pandemic has had a significant impact on international tourism. Travel exports expanded by only 1 per cent in 2019, down from 8 per cent in both 2017 and 2018. This was due to a global decline in international tourist arrivals as a result of a lower disposable income for many consumers, currency depreciation in some countries, and many consumers choosing not to travel. In 2019, world travel receipts still accounted for close to one-quarter of global exports of commercial services, totalling US\$ 1.44 trillion and representing 1.7 per cent of world GDP.
- For the first time since the global financial crisis in 2009, the United States, the world's largest travel exporter with a global share of 13.4 per cent, saw a decline (-2 per cent) in travel exports. In addition, China, the top travel spender with an 18 per cent share in world travel imports, saw its travel-related expenditure drop sharply, by 9 per cent.

 (Annual percentage change for arrivals; index 2014 = 100 for travel expenditure)

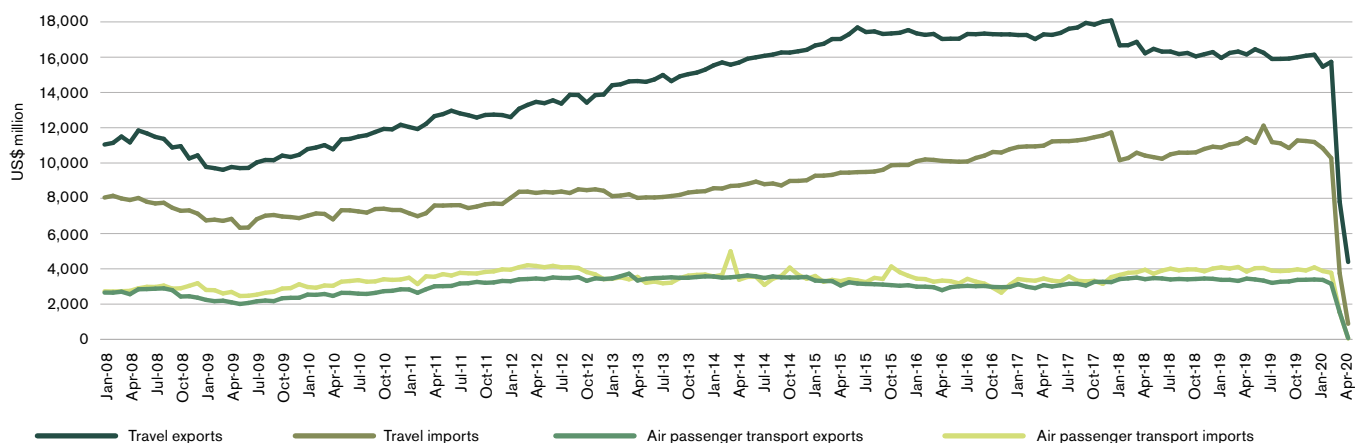

- Following years of rapid annual growth, Chinese tourist arrivals in the United States declined by 5 per cent in 2019, reflecting trade tensions between the two countries. With 2.8 million visitors in 2019, China ranks only fifth in terms of foreign tourist arrivals in the United States. However, China is still the main source of travel receipts for the United States, ahead of Canada and Mexico.
- In 2019, Chinese travellers' expenditure on goods and services in the United States represented around 16 per cent of total US travel receipts. However, it contracted by 3 per cent, to US\$ 31 billion, a lower value than in 2016. Businesses, particularly small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) have been especially hard hit in the hospitality sector as well as in sightseeing, local transportation, retail, entertainment and recreational sectors across the United States.

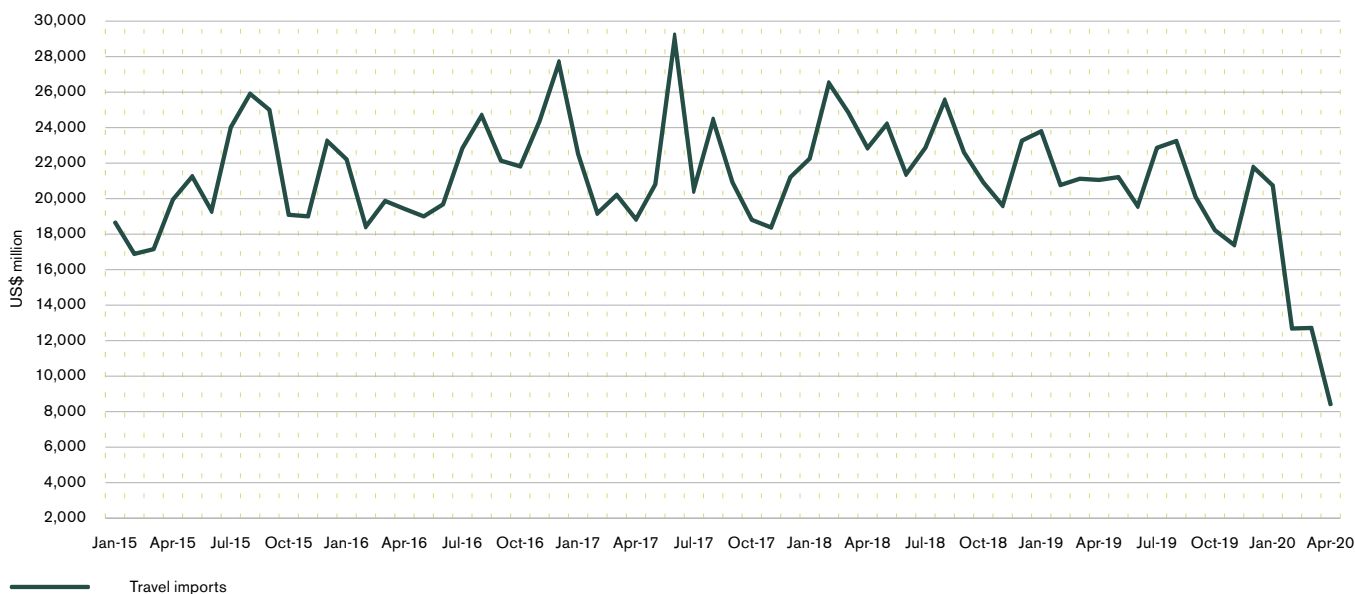
United States – Travel and air passenger transport exports and imports, January 2008 - April 2020

- Trade frictions between China and United States have mostly involved increased tariffs for goods. However, these tensions have spilled over into the services sector, hitting tourism, the least restricted services sector.
- According to China's bilateral data for 2015 and 2016, the latest available years, the United States was the second-largest recipient of Chinese travellers' expenditure abroad (with a 21 per cent share) behind Hong Kong, China. With a 14 per cent share, the United States was also the second-largest main partner for China's travel exports, once again behind Hong Kong, China.⁸ In 2019, US travellers' expenditure in China fell by 3 per cent, with declining revenue for local service providers.
- The COVID-19 pandemic has led to an unprecedented disruption in supply and demand for the global tourism sector, which is expected to see a further decline in tourist arrivals in 2020. Health-related travel and transport restrictions have had an abrupt impact on US travel exports and China's travel imports. US travel exports were down by 73 per cent in April 2020, compared with April 2019, following a 53 per cent plunge in March. China's travel-related expenditure dropped by over 60 per cent in both March and April 2020 year-on-year.

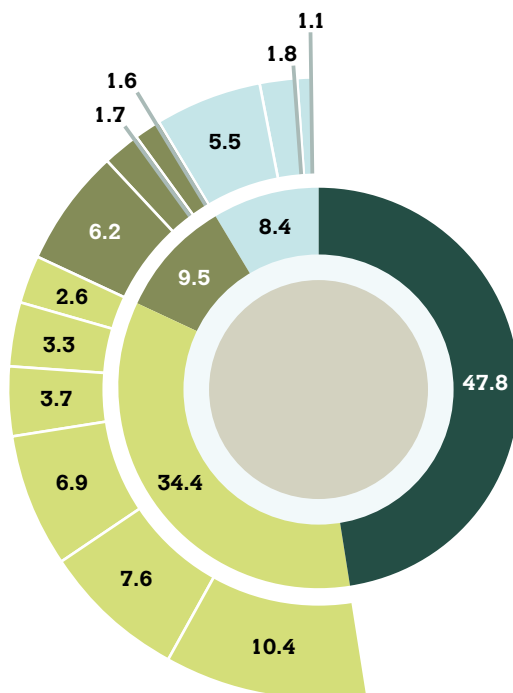

Global supply chains for chemicals and pharmaceutical goods

The COVID-19 crisis has highlighted the importance of maintaining open supply chains for pharmaceutical products, which are critical for combating the virus.

(Percentage share)



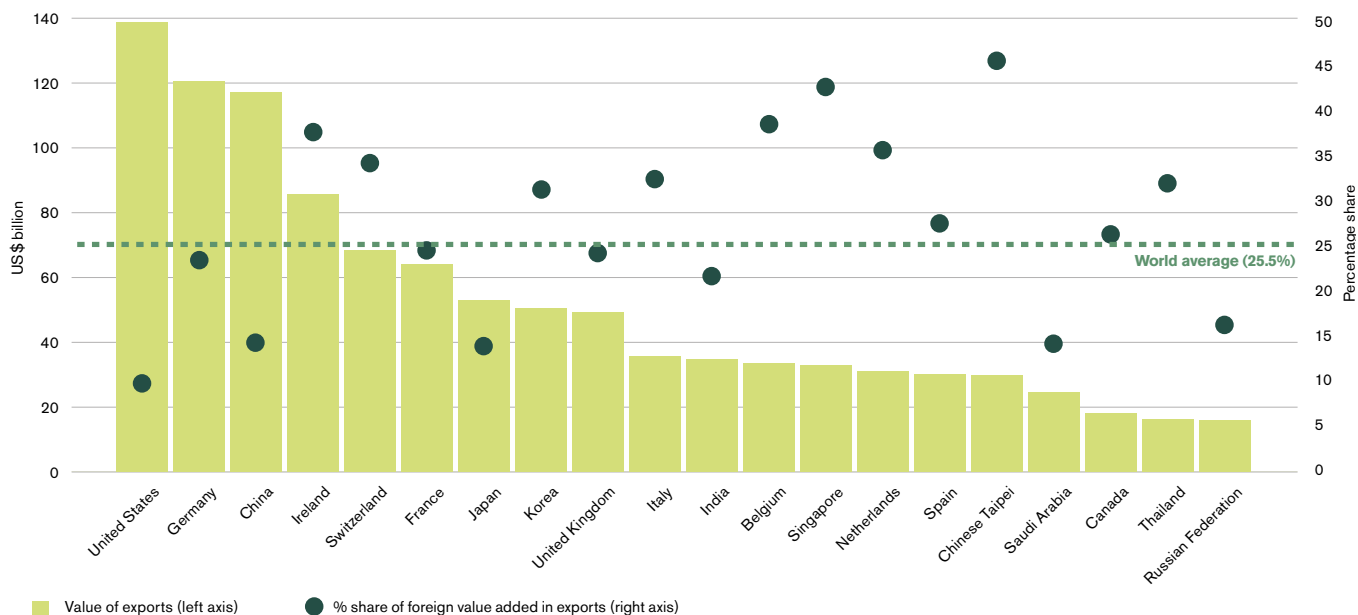

- Based on the latest available data, world exports of chemicals and pharmaceutical products reveal that 47.8 per cent of value added is created in the chemical and pharmaceutical sector while more than half originates from other industries in the supply chain.
- Services account for more than one-third of value added in world exports of chemicals and pharmaceutical products.
- Distribution services, namely wholesale and retail trade, and other business activities account for half of the services value added in world exports of chemicals and pharmaceuticals.
- Government measures aimed at making supply chains more resilient would help economies deal with health crises in the future.

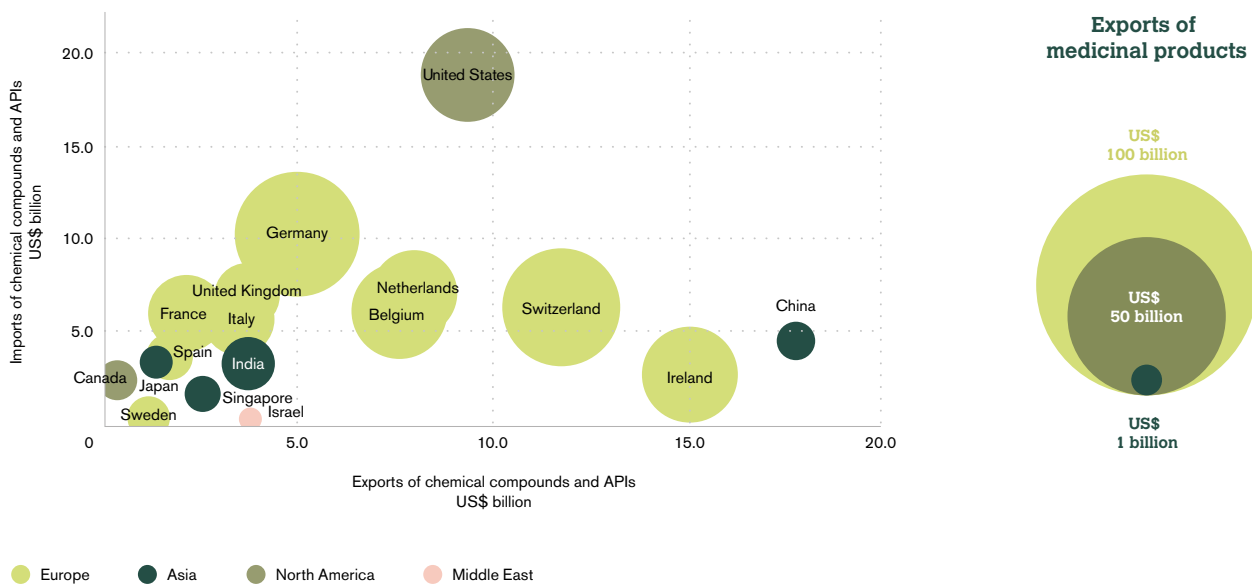
- In 2016, exports of chemicals and pharmaceutical products included on average a 25.5 per cent proportion of foreign inputs supplied by partners in the global value chain.
- The United States had the lowest share of foreign inputs in its exports of chemicals and pharmaceutical products in 2016, totalling less than 10 per cent. Other major exporters such as China and Japan also had low levels of foreign value added, estimated at around 14 per cent.
- Chinese Taipei and Singapore are more dependent on foreign suppliers to produce their exports, with foreign content amounting to more than 40 per cent of the value added in their exports of chemicals and pharmaceutical products.

Trade in intermediate goods in pharmaceutical value chains

In 2019, the United States was the top buyer of raw materials in pharmaceutical supply chains and China was the top supplier. European economies have developed regional value chains that are very active in the supply of pharmaceutical inputs.

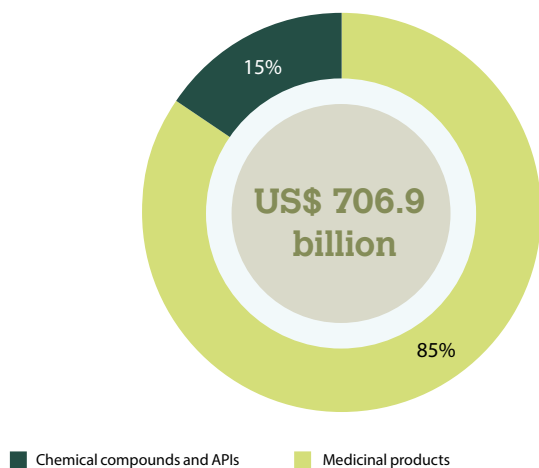
- China was the biggest supplier of raw materials in pharmaceutical value chains in 2019. Its exports of chemical compounds and active pharmaceutical ingredients (APIs) totalled US\$ 17.8 billion, accounting for 16 per cent of world exports of pharmaceutical intermediate products. China has specialized in the production and export of APIs, mostly to European and US companies. China's exports of final medicinal products represented only 1 per cent of world exports.
- Ireland was the world's second-largest supplier of chemical compounds and APIs in 2019, with its exports amounting to US\$ 15.1 billion. Germany and Switzerland were the largest exporters of final medicinal products. They were also active in the supply of intermediate goods and services.
- Switzerland is particularly active in manufacturing APIs needed in complex pharmaceutical products used for treating cancer, for example. These APIs are supplied to processing plants in Austria, Germany and Poland for the manufacturing of medicinal products.
- The United States is the world's largest importer of APIs, with the value of these products totalling US\$ 15 billion in 2019. The US specializes in high-value supply chain tasks such as research and development, patenting products, clinical trials and marketing. It offshores the production of other inputs to economies such as China and India.

Chemical compounds and active pharmaceutical ingredients (APIs)¹¹ are major components of medicinal products, accounting for 15 per cent of world pharmaceutical exports in 2019.

- World exports of pharmaceutical products totalled US\$ 706.9 billion in 2019. Of this total, 85 per cent were final medicinal products while the remaining 15 per cent were intermediate chemical compounds and APIs.
- Chemical compounds and APIs constitute all the chemical inputs, or intermediate goods, embedded in the manufacturing of medicines. Chemical compounds are raw materials for APIs, which constitute the main components of pharmaceutical drugs.
- Medicinal products¹² are final goods, encompassing pharmaceutical drugs, vaccines and other pharmaceutical products, such as blood group reagents and medicated bandages.

Statistical reporting

Statistical reporting has faced a number of challenges in the wake of COVID-19, with delays in some countries providing trade data. Hence, it is too early to quantify the effect of the pandemic on world trade. In addition, the system for classifying goods has not been sufficiently granular to pinpoint all goods related to tackling COVID-19.

- After the outbreak of COVID-19 in February 2020, trade data for the early part of the year were not reported by some countries. As a result, some ad-hoc statistics were used to estimate trade for certain months.
- Shuttle trade, whereby entrepreneurs buy goods abroad for resale in street markets or small shops in their own country, is significant in some economies. Given the complete lockdown and closure of national borders for individuals, shuttle trade between neighboring countries could not take place. Trade flows were also restricted due to a limited number of borders being open, resulting in less declarations at Customs.
- Identifying the full range of goods, medical and non-medical, traded for the treatment and containment of COVID-19 has proved to be difficult. Medical products are distributed across various chapters of the Harmonized System (HS) used to classify goods. The lack of specific HS classification codes for certain products creates difficulties in measuring the trading of these products.
- Existing lists of medical products in the Harmonized System (HS) are for the purpose of facilitating and simplifying Customs processes and not for trade statistics purposes. Moreover, the identified products do not include intermediate goods supplied in global value chains for the production of the final product.
- International cooperation is needed more than ever to leverage resources and update current statistical tools so that the statistical community can effectively measure emerging trends in international trade. These statistics are important for trade policy making and for assisting global containment of the pandemic. An example of this cooperation is the collaborative effort of the World Customs Organization and the World Health Organization to prepare a list of medical supplies related to tackling COVID-19.
- This list, however, is for the purpose of facilitating and simplifying Customs processes and not for trade statistics purposes. Moreover, the identified products do not include intermediate goods supplied in global value chains for the production of the final product.
- International trade statistics have the potential to shape important decisions that will have an impact not only on the recovery of the global economy but on the lives of people around the world.



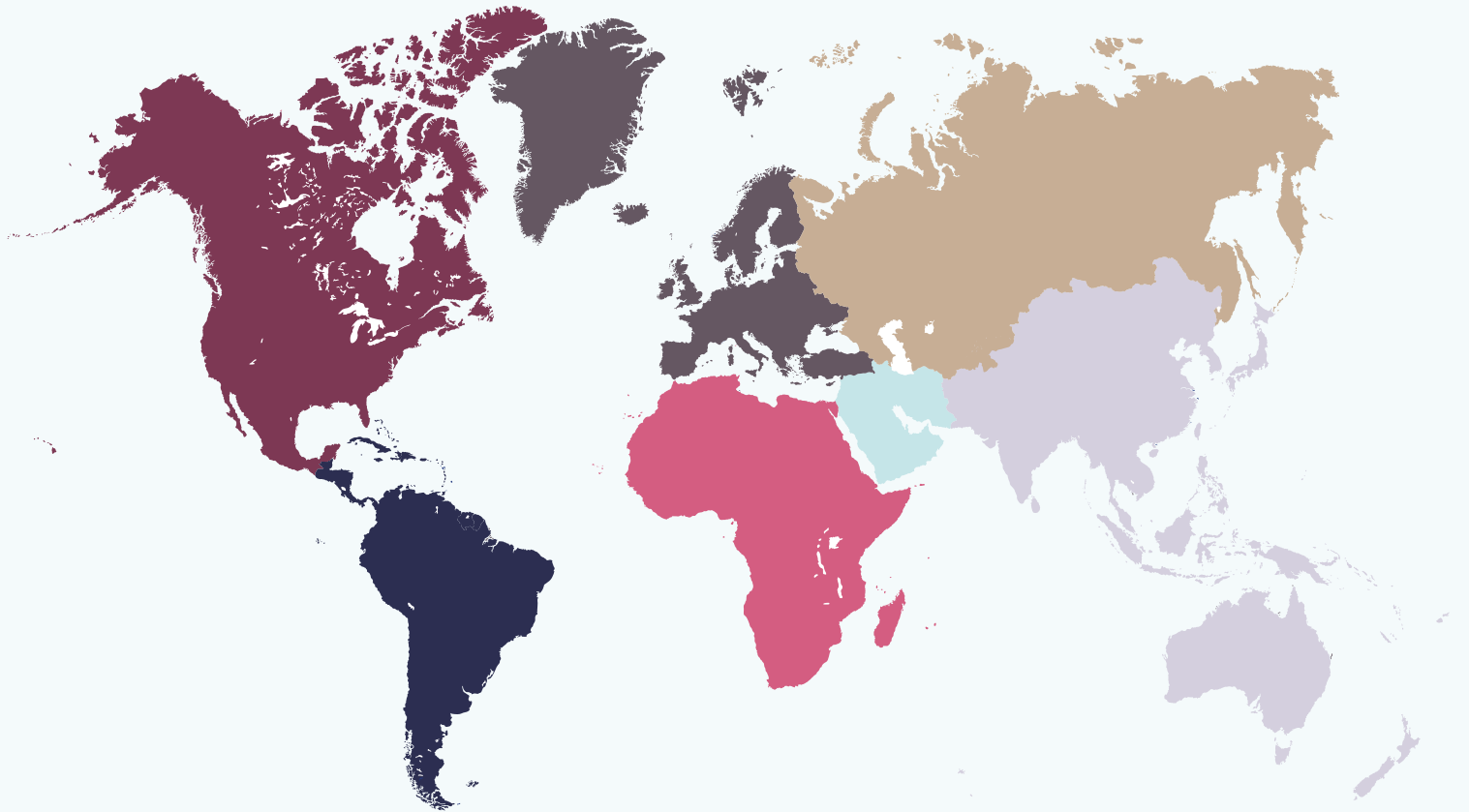

Definitions and methodology

Merchandise trade

Exports and imports

Two systems of recording merchandise exports and imports are in common use. They are referred to as general trade and special trade and differ mainly in the way warehoused and re-exported goods are treated. General trade figures are larger than the corresponding special trade figures because the latter exclude certain trade flows, such as goods shipped through bonded warehouses.

To the extent possible, total merchandise trade is defined in this report according to the general trade definition. It covers all types of inward and outward movement of goods through a country or territory including movements through customs warehouses and free zones. Goods include all merchandise

that either add to or subtract from the stock of material resources of a country or territory by entering (imports) or leaving (exports) the country's economic territory. For further explanations, see United Nations International Trade Statistics, Concepts and Definitions, Series M, N° 52, Revision 2.

Unless otherwise indicated, exports are valued at transaction value, including the cost of transportation and insurance to bring the merchandise to the frontier of the exporting country or territory ("free on board" valuation). Imports are valued at transaction value plus the cost of transportation and insurance to the frontier of the importing country or territory ("cost, insurance and freight" valuation).

Products

All product groups are defined according to Revision 3 of the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC).

Throughout this report, other food products and live animals; beverages and tobacco; animal and vegetable oils, fats and waxes; oilseeds and oleaginous fruit are referred to as other food products; electronic data processing and office equipment is referred to as EDP and office equipment; and integrated circuits and electronic components is referred to as integrated circuits.

Agricultural products according to the AoA (WTO Agreement on Agriculture) definition refer to HS chapters 1 to 24 (excluding fish and fish products) and a number of manufactured agricultural products (for further information see "The Legal Texts, The Results of the Uruguay Round of Multilateral Negotiations", WTO). This definition does not correspond to the definition of agricultural products presented in the breakdown of merchandise trade by main commodity group (see table II.1)

Merchandise trade and the goods account in balance of payments statistics

Merchandise trade statistics serve as an input for the compilation of the goods account in the balance of payments (BOP) and the rest of the world account in the System of National Accounts (SNA).

The compilation of international merchandise trade statistics (IMTS) relies principally on customs records complemented, as appropriate, by additional sources to enhance their coverage (for instance, to include electricity, or trade in vessels and aircrafts). These statistics essentially reflect the physical movement of goods across borders, while National Accounts and BOP statistics record transactions that involve change in ownership.

Goods for processing with or without change of ownership are recorded in merchandise statistics when they enter or leave the economic territory, irrespective of whether a change in ownership takes place. However, goods supplied to another economy for processing without a change of ownership and returned to the economy of the owner after processing are

not recorded in the balance of payments statistics compiled according to BPM6; further, if the goods are sold to a third economy after processing, then the value of the goods (including the value of processing) is recorded as an export of the economy of the owner and an import of the third economy; the value of the processing is recorded as an export of services of the processing economy and an import of services of the economy of the owner.

Differences between BOP (BPM6) and national accounts statistics and IMTS can be found in the International Merchandise Trade Statistics: Compilers Manual, Revision 1 (IMTS 2010), Chapter XXIV Section B «Goods to be recorded differently in IMTS and BPM6/ national accounts» (p288). Trade in commercial services between residents and non-residents of an economy (BPM6)

Depending on the location of the supplier and the consumer, the General Agreement on Trade in Services (GATS) defines four modes of supply. In addition to the cross-border supply (mode 1), where both the supplier and the consumer remain in their respective home territories, GATS also covers cases where consumers are outside their home territory to consume services (mode 2 – consumption abroad), or where service suppliers are in the territory of the consumers to provide their services, whether by establishing affiliates through direct investment abroad (mode 3 – commercial

presence), or through the presence of natural persons (mode 4). An economy's Balance of Payments, namely the services account, can be used to derive estimates covering trade in commercial services for modes 1, 2 and 4. The Balance of Payments does however not include most of the information on services supplied through foreign affiliates that is required to estimate the size of mode 3. A framework for collecting these data, the "Foreign Affiliates Statistics (FATS)" was adopted by the international statistical community for the first time in 2002, and then further developed in 2010.

Trade in commercial services between residents and non-residents of an economy (BPM6), exports and imports

Exports (credits or receipts) and imports (debits or payments) of commercial services are included in balance of payments statistics, in conformity with the concepts, definitions and classification of the sixth (2009) edition of the IMF Balance

of Payments and International Investment Position Manual (BPM6) as well as the 2010 edition of the Manual on Statistics of International Trade in Services (MSITS 2010).

Definition of commercial services in the Balance of Payments

In the sixth edition of the Balance of Payments Manual, the current account is subdivided into goods, services (including government goods and services, n.i.e.), primary income, and secondary income. Commercial services comprise all services categories except government goods and services, n.i.e. Commercial services are sub-divided into goods-related services, transport, travel, and other commercial services.

The BPM6 contains the following 12 standard services components.

- (1) Manufacturing services on physical inputs owned by others
- (2) Maintenance and repair services, n.i.e.
- (3) Transport
- (4) Travel
- (5) Construction
- (6) Insurance and pension services
- (7) Financial services
- (8) Charges for the use of intellectual property, n.i.e.
- (9) Telecommunications, computer and information services
- (10) Other business services
- (11) Personal, cultural and recreational services
- (12) Government goods and services, n.i.e.

Manufacturing services on physical inputs owned by others cover processing, assembly, labelling, packing, and similar activities undertaken by enterprises that do not own the goods concerned and are paid a fee by the owner. Only the fee charged by the processor, which may cover the cost of materials purchased, is included under this item. Examples

include oil refining, liquefaction of natural gas, assembly of clothing and electronics, assembly, labelling, and packing.

Maintenance and repair services n.i.e. cover maintenance and repair work – by residents – on goods that are owned by non-residents (and vice versa). The repairs may be performed at the site of the repairer or elsewhere. The value recorded for maintenance and repairs is the value of the work done – not the gross value of the goods before and after repairs.

Manufacturing services on physical inputs owned by others and Maintenance and repair services n.i.e. form a new WTO aggregate named "Goods-related services".

Transport is the process of carriage of people and objects from one location to another as well as related supporting and auxiliary services. Transport can be classified according to: (i) mode of transport, namely, sea, air, or other ("other" may be further broken down into rail, road, internal waterway, pipeline, and space transport as well as electricity transmission); and (ii) what is carried – passengers or freight. Also included are postal and courier services.

Travel credits cover goods and services – for own use or to give away – acquired by non-residents from an economy during visits to that economy. Travel debits cover goods and services – for own use or to give away – acquired from other economies by residents of the reporting

economy during visits to these other economies. The most common goods and services covered are lodging, food and beverages, entertainment and transportation (within the economy visited), gifts and souvenirs. Travel is further subdivided into: (i) personal travel and (ii) business travel.

The aggregate category “Other commercial services” corresponds to the following components defined in BPM6:

Construction covers the creation, renovation, repair, or extension of fixed assets in the form of buildings, land improvements of an engineering nature, and other similar engineering constructions such as roads, bridges, dams, and so forth. It also includes related installation and assembly work, site preparation, specialized services such as painting, plumbing, and demolition, and management of construction projects. Construction also covers the acquisition of goods and services by the enterprises undertaking construction work from the economy of location of the construction work. Construction can be divided into (i) construction abroad and (ii) construction in the compiling economy.

Insurance and pension services include services of providing life insurance and annuities, nonlife insurance, reinsurance, freight insurance, pensions, standardized guarantees, and auxiliary services to insurance, pension schemes, and standardized guarantee schemes.

Financial services cover financial intermediary and auxiliary services, except insurance and pension fund services, provided by banks and other financial corporations. They include deposit taking and lending, letters of credit, credit card services, commissions and charges related to financial leasing, factoring, underwriting, and clearing of payments. Also included are financial advisory services, custody of financial assets or bullion, financial asset management, monitoring services, liquidity provision services, risk assumption services other than insurance, merger and acquisition services, credit rating services, stock exchange services, and trust services. Financial services may be charged for by: (i) explicit charges; (ii) margins on buying and selling transactions; (iii) asset management costs deducted from property income receivable in the case of asset-holding entities; or (iv) margins between interest payable and the reference rate on loans and deposits (called financial intermediation service charges indirectly measured – FISIM).

Charges for the use of intellectual property n.i.e. include: (i) Charges for the use of proprietary rights (such as patents, trademarks, copyrights, industrial processes and designs including trade secrets, franchises); these rights can arise from research and development, as well as from marketing; and (ii) Charges for licenses to reproduce or distribute (or both) intellectual property embodied in produced originals or prototypes (such as copyrights on books and manuscripts, computer software, cinematographic works, and sound recordings) and related rights (such as for live performances and television, cable, or satellite broadcast). For the purpose of this report, all references to intellectual property (IP) services or intellectual property related services refer only to “Charges for the use of intellectual property n.i.e.”.

Telecommunications, computer and information services cover (i) Telecommunications services, which encompass the broadcast or transmission of sound, images, data, or other information by telephone, telex, telegram, radio and television cable transmission, radio and television satellite, electronic mail, facsimile, and so forth, including business network services, teleconferencing, and support services; (ii) Computer services consisting of hardware- and software-related services and data processing services; (iii) Information services including news agency services, such as the provision of news, photographs, and feature articles to the media as well as database services.

Other business services include (i) Research and development services, (ii) Professional and management consulting services and (iii) Technical, trade-related and other business services. (i) Research and development services consist of services that are associated with basic and applied research, and experimental development of new products and processes. (ii) Professional and management consulting services include (a) legal services, accounting, management consulting, managerial services, and public relations services; and (b) advertising, market research, and public opinion polling services. (iii) Technical, trade-related, and other business services include: (a) architectural, engineering, and other technical services; (b) waste treatment and depollution, agricultural, and mining services; (c) operating leasing services; (d) trade-related services; and (e) other business services n.i.e.

Personal, cultural, and recreational services consist of (i) Audio-visual and related services and (ii) other personal, cultural, and recreational services. (i) Audio-visual and related services cover services and fees related to the production of motion pictures (on film, videotape, disk, or transmitted electronically, etc.), radio and television programs (live or on tape), and musical recordings. (ii) Other personal, cultural, and recreational services include (a) health services, (b) education services, (c) heritage and recreational services, and (d) other personal services. Health services as well as education services are provided remotely or on-site. Data on exports and imports of total services (including government goods and services n.i.e), other services (including government goods and services n.i.e) as well as government goods and services n.i.e. are available as memorandum items in the WTO DATA Portal.

Memo items:

- Total services (Commercial services plus Government goods and services n.i.e)
- Other services (Other commercial services plus Government goods and services n.i.e)
- Government goods and services n.i.e

Government goods and services n.i.e. cover: (a) goods and services supplied by and to enclaves, such as embassies, military bases, and international organizations; (b) goods and services acquired from the host economy by diplomats, consular staff, and military personnel located abroad and their dependents; (c) services supplied by and to governments and not included in other categories of services.

Coverage and comparability

While many economies worldwide have fully implemented the BPM6 for the recording of their Balance of Payments services transactions, some are still compiling their statistics according to the BPM5 methodology. Consequently, comparability and coverage of data may not always be complete. It should be noted in particular that world and regional estimates of trade in new services items such as Manufacturing services on physical inputs owned by others and Maintenance and repair services n.i.e. may be underestimated, as some economies do not report these items yet.

While the coverage and comparability of trade in services statistics have improved significantly over the years, the data remain subject to recognized limitations, such as i) certain countries do not collect figures for all items, ii) statistically capturing some services items remains difficult (more notably on the imports side), iii) data can be reported on a net rather than gross basis, iv) certain transactions may prove complex

to classify appropriately, v) different sources, data collection and estimation methods lead to diverse results, etc. These distortions are more significant on detailed items levels and may lead to considerable asymmetries among countries' reported trade flows by origin and destination.

In June 2020, the United States Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) has revised and expanded its statistics on trade in services for the period 1999-2019. As a result, the classification of certain services transactions, such as audiovisual services, was amended to align them with international statistical guidelines. Thus, statistics contained in this publication are not comparable with earlier reports. Statistics on trade in services for the aggregate "European Union" reflect the sum of trade of individual member countries.

Foreign Affiliates Statistics

The new statistical framework on Foreign Affiliates Statistics (FATS) is developed in the Manual on Statistics of International Trade in Services 2010, the OECD Benchmark Definition of Foreign Direct Investment and the OECD Handbook on Economic Globalisation Indicators. The statistical framework covers both goods and services producing enterprises. It analyses the universe of affiliates for which foreign investors own more than 50 per cent of the voting power or equity interest. Depending on the compiler's view, one can distinguish inward FATS, that is, activities of foreign-owned affiliates in the compiling economy, or, outward FATS, that is, foreign affiliates of the compiling economy active abroad. Variables such as sales, value added, number of employees, etc. are used to describe the affiliates' activities. These variables are broken down by country of origin or destination of investments and also by

type of primary activity of the affiliates. The United States also provide a breakdown into total supply of goods and total supply of services products. In the case of services industries the concept of supply (or output) is based on measures that better capture service output (i.e. the margin). This mainly has an impact on the measurement of activities of wholesalers and retailers, insurers and financial intermediaries. From a GATS perspective, the size of mode 3 in a given country can be approximated through the value of the output (or supply) of services by foreign-owned affiliates. In the absence of data on output, sales of services are used. FATS are currently available mainly for OECD and a small number of non-OECD economies. Given the recent development of these statistics, comparability and coverage of individual economy data may not always be complete. Availability of detailed data and long-time series varies considerably between economies.

Trade in global value chains

The measurement of trade in value added terms traces the source of the value added, by country and industry that is contained in the products (goods and services) traded across the world. Value added is defined as the value that is added by industries to produce goods and services. In a national account sense, it reflects the compensation of labour, capital, nonfinancial assets and natural resources used in the production as well as net indirect taxes, when relevant.

The value-added approach reflects the interconnection of economies and sectors as well as the increasing importance of trade in intermediate inputs that takes place among international supply and production chains. It provides insights on where the value added comes from and thus on the actual contribution of trade to economies. Trade in value added indicators are estimates based on Inter-Country Input-Output

(ICIO) tables. ICIO tables cover both goods and services. They regroup national Input-Output tables and international trade statistics into a consistent framework to describe sale and purchase of goods and services between producers and consumers from various economies and industries. They enable to disentangle domestic and foreign value added in each economy and industry.

Trade in value added estimates presented in this publication are sourced from the OECD-WTO “Trade in value added” (TiVA) database and the OECD ICIO table. The latter covers 57 economies plus a “rest of the world” aggregate. Industries are regrouped into 37 sectors and cover productive activities in the primary, secondary and tertiary sectors classified according to the International Standard Industrial Classification (ISIC) Revision 4.

The decomposition of gross exports into their value-added components

The breakdown of conventional export data (gross) into their value-added components allows showing the role played by economies in global value chains. The **domestic value-added content of exports** is composed of the following indicators:

(i) The domestic value added, embodied either in final or intermediate goods/services, directly consumed by the importing country. This represents a one-to-one country transfer of value added, with exported goods/services crossing borders only once. (ii) The domestic value added contained in intermediates exported to a first country which re-exports them to a third country as embodied in other goods/services. This indicator represents a one-to-many country transfer of value added, when exported goods/

services cross borders more than once. This illustrates the level of participation of an economy within international production. (iii) The domestic value added of exported goods/services which is eventually re-imported by the country itself. Such a value added round-trip between two countries highlights the domestic value-added content present in a country’s imports.

The **foreign value-added content of exports** corresponds to the value added of inputs that was imported in order to produce intermediate or final goods/services to be exported. It can also be referred to as vertical specialization, when expressed in percentage.

The sectoral value-added contributions to gross exports

Exports from a (domestic) industry do not only contain value added produced within the same industry but also value added sourced from other industries within the economy or from other economies. The value-added approach to estimate trade flows can describe both the geographical and sectoral origin of the value added contained in gross exports of any

given industry. Table IV.3 presents the value-added origin (columns) of gross exports (rows) according to the domestic and foreign source and by main sector. This highlights the extent of the global value chains phenomenon and outlines the interconnection and related dependency across countries and sectors for the production and trade of goods and services.

Other definitions and methods

Annual changes

Throughout this report, average annual percentage changes are analogous to compound interest rates. In calculating the average annual rate of change between 2010 and 2019, for example, data for calendar year 2010 were taken as the starting point, and data for calendar year 2019 as the end point.

Prices

Commodity price movements are primarily described by indices largely based on spot market prices, and therefore exclude transactions governed by longer-term contracts.

Price indices for such commodities as food, beverages, agricultural raw materials, minerals, non-ferrous metals, fertilizers and crude petroleum are obtained from IMF Primary Commodity Prices (May 2018 release). Aggregates for all primary commodities and for non-fuel primary commodities are calculated using IMF weights (Statistical appendix table A67). Beginning with the first quarter of 2011 to the fourth quarter of 2015, the crude oil price is computed excluding West Texas Intermediate (WTI), which accounts for one third of the IMF’s crude oil index. The price of WTI became largely dislocated from international markets in early 2011 and is thought not to represent well prices in international oil trade. For more information, see Box Comm.1 of the World Bank’s

World merchandise trade indices

The volume indices and the deflators (i.e. price indices or unit values) are taken from a range of different international and national sources. The reported deflators and volume indices may not always be available for the most recent years or may differ in product coverage from the corresponding value indices. Aggregation of the indices to obtain a world total is a two-tier process. First, export and import deflators from national and international sources are complemented with WTO and UNCTAD estimates for missing data. They are then aggregated to obtain regional totals. The volume index for each region is obtained by dividing the respective trade value index for each region by the corresponding regional deflator. Second, the total world merchandise volume index is obtained by deflating the world trade value with the aggregate of regional deflators. Throughout the aggregation process trade values of the previous year are used as weights.

World gross domestic product

World GDP growth is estimated as a weighted average of individual economies' real GDP growth. The weights used are shares of the economies' previous year GDP at 2005 constant prices converted to dollars at market exchange rates.

The use of official exchange rates which are not market-based for some major economies, together with the fluctuations of the United States dollar vis-à-vis major currencies, can have a significant impact on the weighting pattern. The increasing use of weights based on purchasing power parities (PPP) by other international organizations is meant to attenuate

"anomalies" linked to these factors. In a period of widely diverging growth rates among countries and regions, the choice of the weighting pattern can have a marked influence on the global growth estimate. For the 2000-2011 period, global growth estimates based on PPP-weights indicate a significantly faster growth than estimates using weights based on GDP data measured at market exchange rates. This is because of differences in the two weighting patterns.

Re-exports and re-imports

Under the system of general trade adopted in this report, re-exports are included in total merchandise trade. However, in the case of Hong Kong, China, the magnitude of its reexports (amounting in 2019 to \$517 billion), if included in regional or world aggregates, would adversely affect the analytical value of the statistics by introducing a significant element of double counting. Therefore, Hong Kong, China's re-exports are excluded from the world, Asia and developing economies aggregates (unless otherwise indicated); only Hong Kong, China's domestic exports and retained imports are included in the totals.

Specific notes for selected economies

Merchandise trade statistics of the European Union

Beginning with the 2002 report, EU data compiled according to national statistical practices have been replaced, starting 1993, with data compiled by Eurostat in accordance with EU legislation. The concepts and definitions adopted by the EU are in line with the United Nations' International Trade Statistics, Concepts and Definitions, Series M, N° 52, Revision 2. As a result, the conceptual differences between EU member states' data have been substantially reduced. Moreover, for the EU as a whole, Eurostat data are more timely than the previous source, thus reducing substantially the amount of estimation included in the EU aggregate.

Since January 1993, statistics on the trade between the member states of the EU have been collected through the "Intrastat" system (see GATT 1994, International Trade Trends and Statistics). The coverage of this system, which relies on reports submitted by firms for transactions above a minimum value, is not as wide as the previous one, which was based on customs declarations. This is particularly noticeable on the import side. For example, prior to the adoption of the Intrastat system, reported intra-EU imports (c.i.f.) closely matched reported intra-EU exports (f.o.b.).

Major breaks in data continuity of merchandise trade

Beginning 2003, Singapore includes merchandise trade with Indonesia. Beginning 2008, Indonesia's imports are reported according to the general trade system. With respect to the Russian Federation, considerable uncertainty remains about the accuracy of foreign trade statistics, especially as regards imports. A large proportion of the reported data on imports

consists of official estimates of inflows of goods which enter the economy without being registered by the

customs authorities. Such adjustments to import data accounted for 6 per cent of the officially reported totals in 2012; 8 per cent of the officially reported totals in 2013. As of 2012, data on merchandise trade values for Switzerland includes trade in non-monetary gold. Merchandise trade flows between the European Union member States include trade associated with fraudulent VAT declaration, which concerns mainly office and telecommunications equipment.

Figures for total merchandise trade are largely derived from national sources, supplemented by international databases and Secretariat estimates. Data on merchandise trade by origin, destination and product are mainly obtained from Eurostat's Comext database, the Trade Data Monitor and UNSD's Comtrade database. Some inconsistencies in the aggregate export and import data for the same country or territory between sources are inevitable. These can be attributed to the use of different systems of recording trade, to the way in which for example IMF and UNSD have converted data expressed in national currencies into dollars, and revisions which can be more readily incorporated in the IMF data.

Statistics on trade in commercial services are mainly drawn from the IMF Balance of Payments Statistics or from the Trade in Services by Partner Country dataset of the OECD. Data for European Union members are drawn from Eurostat's on-line database. European Union figures for partner 'World' are the aggregates of its 27 member (per 2020 membership) country data. European Union intra-trade and extra-trade are aggregated based on the quarterly BOP data set published by Eurostat and may not correspond to total EU aggregates, which are based on annual statistics of the individual countries.
